RETURN TO IN-PERSON SERVICES

As it was announced that effective June 8, 2020, places of worship may resume services provided social distancing of two metres can be maintained between each individual household. The allowable occupancy is one-third of the defined occupancy rate of the facility to a maximum of 30 individuals for the initial stage of re-opening. Following these guidelines, Bishop Bryan has written a pastoral letter with instructions for all churches in the Eparchy of Saskatoon. SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOAST

He who gives alms should do so generously; he who rules should exercise his authority with care; he who performs works of mercy should do so cheerfully. Your love must be sincere. Detest what is evil, cling to what is good. Love one another with the affection of brothers. Anticipate each other in showing respect. Do not grow slack but be fervent in spirit; he whom you serve is the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient under trial, persevere in prayer. Look on the needs of the saints as your own; be generous in offering hospitality. Bless your persecutors; bless and do not curse them.

ALLELUIA VERSES: Your mercies, O Lord, I will sing for ever; from generation to generation I will announce Your truth with my mouth.

For You have said: Mercy shall be built up for ever; in the heavens Your truth shall be prepared.

GOSPEL: Matthew 9:1-8

At that time Jesus re-entered the boat, made the crossing, and came back to his own town. There the people at once brought to him a paralyzed man lying on a mat. When Jesus saw their faith he said to the paralytic, "Have courage, son, your sins are forgiven." At that some of the scribes said to themselves, "The man blasphemes." Jesus was aware of what they were thinking and said: "Why do you harbor evil thoughts? Which is less trouble to say, 'Your sins are forgiven' or 'Stand up and walk'? To help you realize that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" -- he then said to the paralyzed man -- "Stand up! Roll up your mat, and go home." The man stood up and went toward his home. At the sight, a feeling of awe came over the crowd, and they praised God for giving such authority to men.


Divine Liturgy Celebration & Presentation for Young People at St. Volodymyr Ukrainian Eparchial Park



Appeal to Provide Financial Assistance to Those Affected by the Flood in Western Ukraine

[How we, as the Eparchy of Saskatoon, can help]



As you may already know, parts of Western Ukraine are under water due to strong torrential rains that have been falling for several days in the past week. Two regions, Ivano-Frankivsk and Chernivtsi, were affected the most. In the Ivano-Frankivsk region, over 4,600 houses were lost or flooded, 550 kilometers of roads were damaged or washed away, and 90 bridges are gone. In addition, at least three people lost their lives. Thousands of people had to be evacuated leaving their homes and properties behind. Many have lost their belongings and savings.

This is the time when our brothers and sisters in Ukraine need help. Patriarch Sviatoslav has sent a letter of appeal asking us, "to show Christian solidarity and social service, so that those who are suffering might receive assistance as soon as possible. Therefore, I call upon our faithful and churches in our Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Saskatoon to act in the spirit of the Good Samaritan of the Gospel, to support those who are deprived of their homes and have come face-to-face with misfortune."

In response to our Patriarch's request and in the spirit of Christian love and fellowship, we are announcing a campaign to raise funds for people who lost everything due to the floods and now need food and basic necessities.

 and complete and submit the form, noting in the "Comments" box that this donation is directed for the
 "Western Ukraine Relief Fund".
- Donations can also be made by cheque made out to the Ukrainian Catholic Foundation and marked "Western Ukraine Relief Fund", and mailed or dropped off at the UCF-SASK Foundation Office at 214 Avenue M South, Saskatoon SK S7M 2K4.
- Donations can also be dropped in your parish collection basket or parish office which will then forwarded to the Foundation Office.

All the donations received will then be forwarded through our Eparchy to the CNEWA Canada Office in Ottawa to distribute the funds to those affected by the Flood in Western Ukraine.

Steps to send funds to St. Athanasius via e-transfers:

You must have on-line banking availability. If you don't already have this, you will have to make a request for this from your financial institution (bank, credit union, trust company, etc.)

- Sign in to your account
- Select "Payments and Transfers"
- Select interac e-transfer; select new recipient/manage recipients: St. Athanasius Email: stathandeposit@sasktel.net
- Enter your amount of the donation
- Indicate which account to debit
- Add a message: use your envelope number; add a note such as "Sunday Donation", Building Fund", or name of a special collection (Easter flowers, Holy Land, etc.)
- Verify e-transfer.
- Your funds should now transfer from your bank account to the parish bank account.

Dear Friends

Greetings! We thought it was timely to send you a greeting and to tell you how things have been going for us. More than three months have passed since we served our last meal in our dining room. Since then we have been serving bagged lunches at the door and have been working without the help of our volunteers — whom me miss! The numbers of persons coming for the lunches (men, women and children) has varied but most days we are serving between 80 and 110 persons. We have had the wonderful support of many of you, providing muffins and all the fixing for our lunch bags (meat, cheese, juice boxes, fruit, granola bars) which are much appreciated. While this is a limited form of hospitality, it is what our circumstances have permitted — and it has been gratefully received. We are able to respond to special requests as well — clothing, personal hygiene and other needed items, such as we have them

As we look forward to the next couple of months, this is what we are hoping to do. We will continue to serve lunches at the door through the month of July. We will be closed, as in years past, for the month of August, and the five of us will have the opportunity for some holiday time and to work on special projects in the house. In September we will resume with serving lunches at the door and make preparations for re-opening our dining room. This will likely take place toward the end of that month or the beginning of October. Following the required social distancing restrictions will mean that we will only be able to serve a limited number of persons at one time. For us, this likely means that we will only be able to seat between 18 and 25 persons at one time and will need to work with fewer volunteers, who are willing to wear face masks and try to follow the advised social distancing. Of course, the way we serve food will have to change and we will likely have to lengthen the time for our noon meal in order to accommodate the turnover of limited seating. We will also probably offer the alternative of carry-out to facilitate the limitations on space.


How can we best serve in these current circumstances? We are listening to what the government health authority directs, but also what God seems to be asking and taking such steps as seem to be clear to us.
