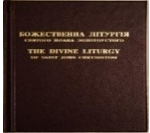

RETURN TO IN-PERSON SERVICES

As it was announced that effective June 8, 2020, places of worship may resume services provided social distancing of two metres can be maintained between each individual household. The allowable occupancy is one-third of the defined occupancy rate of the facility to a maximum of 30 individuals for the initial stage of re-opening. EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

TROPAR & KONDAK: Tone 1, Page 89 of the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom Book

TROPAR (Tone 1): Though the stone was sealed by the Jews and soldiers guarded Your most pure body, You arose, O Savior, on the third day, and gave life to the world. And so the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of life: Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Your kingdom! Glory to Your saving plan, O only Lover of Mankind.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

KONDAK (Tone 1): You arose in glory from the tomb and with Yourself You raised the world. All humanity acclaims You as God, and death has vanished* Adam exults, O Master, and Eve, redeemed now from bondage, cries out for joy: "You are the One, O Christ, Who offer resurrection to all."

EPISTLE: A reading from the Second Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (9:6-11)
Brothers and Sisters! He who sows sparingly will reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will reap bountifully. Everyone must give according to what he has inwardly decided; not sadly, not grudgingly, for God loves a cheerful giver. God can multiply his favors among you so that you may always have enough of everything and even a surplus for good works, as it is written: "He scattered abroad and gave to the poor, his justice endures forever." He who supplies seed for the sower and bread for the eater will provide in abundance; he will multiply the seed you sow and increase your generous yield. In every way your liberality is enriched; through us it results in thanks offered to God.

ALLELUIA VERSES: *God gives me vindication, and has subdued peoples under me.
Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to His posterity for ever.*

GOSPEL: Luke 5:1-11

At that time as he stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd pressed in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats moored by the side of the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to pull out a short distance from the shore; then, remaining seated, he continued to teach the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have been hard at it all night long and have caught nothing; but if you say so, I will lower the nets." Upon doing this they caught such a great number of fish that their nets were at the breaking point. They signaled to their mates in the other boat to come and help them. These came, and together they filled the two boats until they nearly sank. At the sight of this, Simon Peter fell at the knees of Jesus saying, "Leave me, Lord. I am a sinful man." For indeed, amazement at the catch they had made seized him and all his shipmates, as well as James and John, Zebedee's sons, who were partners with Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will be catching men." With that they brought their boats to land, left everything, and became his followers.

OBITUARY for Father Leonard Ratushniak, CSsR

Fr. Leonard Ratushniak, C.Ss.R., fell asleep in the Lord on September 27, 2020 at Holy Family Home in Winnipeg, after a valiant battle with cancer. He is predeceased by his parents Stephen and Amelia Ratushniak and survived by his sister, Sandra Herbison (Robert), and his brother, Andrew and nieces and nephews: Jeremy (Krista), Kathleen, Marshall, Carmen (Scott), and Alanna and grandnephews Louis, Sean and Beau.



Fr. Len was born in Canora, SK on February 8, 1942. After graduating from St. Vladimir's College in Roblin, MB, he entered the Redemptorist Novitiate in Meadowvale, ON and professed his first vows as a Redemptorist on August 28, 1961. He pursued seminary studies and completed an ecclesiastical and civil degree in theology at St. Paul's University, Ottawa, ON in 1968. On June 24, 1967, Bishop

Andrew Roborecki ordained him to the priesthood in St. Mary's Church, Yorkton, SK.

Fr. Len served in various Ukrainian Catholic Churches in Canada and the United States. His first assignment was as assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church, Yorkton, SK (1968-72) where he would return as assistant again in 1981-84 and then as pastor 1990-96. He served as pastor of Immaculate Conception Church, Hillside, N.J. (1972-75), of Sacred Heart Parish, Wynyard, SK (1975-77; 1987-90). In 1978-81, he was assistant pastor of St. Joseph's, Winnipeg. He was assigned as pastor of Sacred Heart in Ituna, SK (1984-87). In 1996-99, he was assistant at The Welcome Home mission in Winnipeg and then assistant pastor of Ss. Peter & Paul Parish in Saskatoon from 1999-2002. He served briefly in St. John the Baptist, Newark, N.J. and then returned to Wynyard (2002-05). His last assignment before his retirement was as pastor of St. Andrew's Church, Winnipeg, MB (2005-2019) while he lived at The Welcome Home (2005-2011) and then at St. Joseph's (2011-20).

Fr. Len will be remembered for what brought joy to him and those around him: His heart warming pastoral visits or friendly chats over a cup of coffee; his amazing ability with crossword puzzles (perhaps being Editor of Redeemer's Voice magazine (English Edition – 1979-84, gave him an edge); he enjoyed youth ministry and was a "founding director" of Ukrainian Catholic Youth for Christ in Saskatchewan (1976) and the Saskatoon Eparchial Spiritual Director of the Ukrainian Catholic Youth (UCY) from 1984-1994; his love for The Welcome Home where his humble, gentle way and sense of humor was a comforting presence to many.

Guided by the most recent Covid-19 restrictions, a viewing was on Wednesday, September 30 from 1-4 PM at St. Andrew's Ukrainian Catholic Church, 160 Euclid Ave., Winnipeg. Please note that no more than 10 people will be permitted in the church for a brief time. Masks must be worn. Later on Wednesday, a private Priestly Parastas will be celebrated by Metropolitan Lawrence Huculak, OSBM and Fr. Len's Redemptorist confreres.

Funeral Services were held at St. Mary's Ukrainian Catholic Church, Yorkton, SK on Thursday, October 1 at 7:00 pm and a Funeral Divine Liturgy was celebrated on Friday, October 2 at 10:00 am. Interment will take place in the Redemptorist Section of the Yorkton City Cemetery.

OCTOBER 1

PROTECTION OF THE THEOTOKOS



The name of the feast—Protection—is a translation of the Ukrainian word, *pokrov*. However, “protection” does not convey the full significance of *pokrov*, which has several meanings. First, of all, it refers to a cloak or shroud; it also means protection or intercession. For this reason, the name of the feast is also translated as the Veil of Our Lady, the Protecting Veil of the Theotokos, or the Intercession of the Theotokos. Indeed, it would take a rather long English language sentence to express the full meaning. We are given the mental image of a caring and loving mother, spreading her cloak to shelter her children from harm. It is an image to which any child can relate.

In Byzantine iconography, the Mother of God is most often depicted with her Son, our Lord. Commonly, she is holding Him as any loving mother would. In other icons, she appears alone, interceding before Jesus on our behalf. As early as the third century, Christians were turning to the Theotokos, as evidenced in this Coptic prayer of that time. “Under your protection we seek refuge, holy Mother of God.” In various icons we see her with the palms of her hands turned upwards towards heaven. In icons of the Protecting Veil, she retains this pose, while holding her veil or *prokov* spread between her outstretched arms, even as she did for the people of Constantinople.

On the Feast of the Protection, like those ancient Christians, we once again pray to the Theotokos for her motherly intercession, in the Kontakion:

“Today the Virgin stands in the midst of the Church, and with choirs of saints she invisibly prays to God for us. Angels and bishops worship, apostles and prophets rejoice together, since for our sake she prays to the pre-eternal God”.
