On Monday afternoon, December 14 at 3:00 pm, Dr. Saqib Shahab, Saskatchewan's Chief Medical Health Officer, announced revised public health orders effective this Thursday, December. 17<sup>th</sup>. These remain in effect until Friday, January 15, 2021, unless amended.

### The revisions affecting places of worship are as follows:

The Places of Worship Guidelines are established under the provisions of the Public Health Act of Saskatchewan and are legally binding on all residents of Saskatchewan. The government has asked the police to step up enforcement and we have seen a number of local health inspectors looking closely at places of worship. The faith leaders' group has asked all faith communities to protect vulnerable people by following these guidelines.

#### 30-person capacity, no concurrent services:

Over the past three weeks there have been discussions regarding the November. 27 health order. These have led to differing rulings by local health inspectors and considerable confusion for local faith communities. The text of the Places of Worship Guidelines has been revised to read: "All places of worship must reduce capacity to 30 people, including wedding, funeral, and baptismal services. No food or drink may be present or served. Services must be held in their usual location. Concurrent services in other rooms within the facility are not permitted." This means that the 30-person capacity limit applies to the whole facility, not to individual rooms.

For clarification, the 30-person capacity does not include the minimal number of clergy and other leaders required to facilitate the service. However, faith communities are encouraged to keep this number at a reasonable level.

#### SUNDAY AFTER THEOPHANY

**FIRST ANTIPHON**: When Israel came forth from Egypt, the house of Jacob from a people of alien tongue. *Through the prayers of the Mother of God, O Saviour save us.* Judah became His sanctuary, Israel His domain. *Through the prayers of ...* The sea beheld and fled, Jordan turned back. *Through the prayers ...* Why is it, O sea, that you flee? O Jordan, that you turn your back? *Through the prayers ...* Glory be to the Father...(P. 23 of Liturgy books)

**THIRD ANTIPHON**: Come, let us sing joyfully to the Lord, let us acclaim God, our Saviour. **Son of God, baptized by John in the Jordan, save us who sing to You: Alleluia!** Let us come before His face with praise, and acclaim Him in psalms. **Son of God, baptized...** For God is the great Lord and the great king over all the earth. **Son of God, baptized...** 

**ENTRANCE**: Come, let us worship and fall down before Christ. **Son of God, baptized by John in the Jordan, save us who sing to You: Alleluia!** 

**TROPAR** (Tone 7): By Your cross You destroyed death; You opened Paradise to the thief; You changed the lamentation of the myrrh-bearers to joy, and charged the apostles to proclaim that You are risen, O Christ, our God, offering great mercy to the world.

**FEASTDAY TROPAR (Tone 1):** At your baptism in the Jordan, O Lord, worship of the Trinity was revealed; for the Father's voice bore witness to You, calling You his beloved Son, and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the truth of these words. O Christ God, who appeared and enlightened the world, glory be to You!

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

**FEASTDAY KONDAK (Tone 4):** Today You have revealed Yourself to the universe, and Your light O Lord has shone upon us who spiritually sing to You: You have come and revealed yourself, O inaccessible light.

**PROKIMEN (Tone 1):** Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You. **Verse:** Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous.

# **EPISTLE:** A reading from the second Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to Ephesians (4:7-13)

Brothers and Sisters! Each of us has received God's favor in the measure in which Christ bestows it. Thus you find Scripture saying: "When he ascended on high, he took a host of captives and gave gifts to men." "He ascended," what does this mean but that he had first descended into the lower regions of the earth? He who descended is the very one who ascended high above the heavens, that he might fill all men with his gifts. It is he who gave apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers in roles of service for the faithful to build up the body of Christ, till we become one in faith and in the knowledge of God's Son, and form that perfect man who is Christ come to full stature.

**ALLELUIA VERSES:** God gives me vindication, and has subdued peoples under me. Making great the salvation of the King, and showing mercy to His anointed, David, and to His posterity for ever.

#### GOSPEL: Matthew (4:12-17)

At that time when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went down to live in Capernaum by the sea near the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, to fulfill what had been said through Isaiah the prophet: "Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali along the sea beyond the Jordan, heathen Galilee: A people living in darkness has seen a great light. On those who inhabit a land overshadowed by death, light has arisen." From that time on Jesus began to proclaim this theme: "Reform your lives! The kingdom of heaven is at hand."

**INSTEAD OF 'It is truly right...':** O my soul, glorify Christ the King baptized in the River Jordan. No tongue has the power to fittingly extol you; and even a supernatural mind is powerless to glorify you, O Mother of God. But in your graciousness, accept our faith because you know our holy ambition; for you are the protectress of Christians, and we extol you.

**COMMUNION HYMN:** The grace of God has appeared, offering salvation to all men. Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

SPECIAL NOTE: For those who are in church today, we will be reciting the regular prayer before communion.

**INSTEAD OF "Blessed is He..."**, **"We have seen the true light..."**, **"May our mouths..."**, **and "Blessed be the name..."**: All creation is filled with rejoicing today, for Christ is baptized in the Jordon.

#### SUNDAY AFTER THEOPHANY



This time after the Theophany the Gospel introduces the person and work of John the Baptist, who reveals to his contemporaries a different road to follow, a different path of faith. This path is the path of *conversion*. What does the word 'conversion' mean? In the Bible it means to change direction and orientation; and thus also to change one's way of thinking. It comes from the Greek word "Matanoia" – which means to change one's way of thinking.

In the moral and spiritual life, to convert means to turn oneself from evil to good, from sin to love of God. And this is what the Baptist was teaching, who in the desert of Judea was "preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins". Receiving baptism was an outward and visible sign of the conversion of those who had listened to his preaching and decided to repent. That baptism occurred with immersion in the Jordan, in water and it was useless if there was no willingness to repent and change one's life.

Conversion involves the desire to be free from sins, the intention to exclude them from one's own life forever. Conversion involves two elements: Detachment from too much worldly things and seeking God and his kingdom. Abandoning a worldly mentality is not an end in itself; it is not a way of living in fear of God and to do penance:

a Christian is not like this. To be a Christian means something else. It means of attaining something greater, namely, the Kingdom of God, communion with God, friendship with God.

For some people of our time the word Conversion can even recall a discouraging thought. It is not that they don't want to be good Christians or people who don't want believe. Many would like to go that different path of conversion, to change a way of thinking, but they feel they cannot do it? One could ask - what to do in this case?

First of all, we should remind ourselves that conversion *is a grace*: no one can convert by his or own strength. It is a grace that the Lord gives you, and thus we need to forcefully ask God for it. To ask God to convert us, that we can truly convert, to the degree in which we open ourselves up to the beauty, the goodness, the tenderness of God. Think about God's tenderness. God is not a bad father, an unkind father, no. He is tender. He loves us so much, like the Good Shepherd, who searches for the last member of his flock.

This is the way we should understand the word conversion as a grace of God who is with us. We don't have to search for God but to open ourselves to Him. Like the shepherd's ad Magi were open to receive the message of God, beginning a different path of faith, because it is God who moves us to a different path in order to open ourselves to Him, to his Word, to his love which restores and saves.
