On Monday afternoon, December 14 at 3:00 pm, Dr. Saqib Shahab, Saskatchewan's Chief Medical Health Officer, announced revised public health orders effective this Thursday, December. 17th. These remain in effect until Friday, January 15, 2021, unless amended.

The revisions affecting places of worship are as follows:

The Places of Worship Guidelines are established under the provisions of the Public Health Act of Saskatchewan and are legally binding on all residents of Saskatchewan. The government has asked the police to step up enforcement and we have seen a number of local health inspectors looking closely at places of worship. The faith leaders' group has asked all faith communities to protect vulnerable people by following these guidelines.

30-person capacity, no concurrent services:

Over the past three weeks there have been discussions regarding the November. 27 health order. These have led to differing rulings by local health inspectors and considerable confusion for local faith communities. The text of the Places of Worship Guidelines has been revised to read: "All places of worship must reduce capacity to 30 people, including wedding, funeral, and baptismal services. No food or drink may be present or served. Services must be held in their usual location. Concurrent services in other rooms within the facility are not permitted." This means that the 30-person capacity limit applies to the whole facility, not to individual rooms.

For clarification, the 30-person capacity does not include the minimal number of clergy and other leaders required to facilitate the service. However, faith communities are encouraged to keep this number at a reasonable level.

TROPAR & KONDAK: Tone 8, Page 105 of the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom Book.

TROPAR (Tone 8): You came down from on high, O Merciful One, and accepted three days of burial to free us from our sufferings. O Lord, our life and our resurrection, glory be to You.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

KONDAK (Tone 8): When You rose from the tomb, You also raised the dead and resurrected Adam. Eve exults in Your resurrection, and the ends of the world celebrate Your rising from the dead, O most merciful One.

PROKIMEN (Tone 8): Pray and give praise to the Lord our God. **Verse:** In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel.

EPISTLE: A reading from the First Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to Timothy (4:9-15)

Timothy, my son! You can depend on this as worthy of complete acceptance. This explains why we work and struggle as we do; our hopes are fixed on the living God who is the savior of all men, but especially of those who believe. Such are the things you must urge and teach. Let no one look down on you because of your youth, but be a continuing example of love, faith, and purity to believers. Until I arrive, devote yourself to the reading of Scripture, to preaching and teaching. Do not neglect the gift you received when, as a result of prophecy, the presbyters laid their hands on you. Attend to your duties; let them absorb you, so that everyone may see your progress.

ALLELUIA VERSES: Come, let us rejoice in the Lord; let us acclaim God our Savior. Let us come before His countenance with praise and acclaim Him with psalms.

GOSPEL: Luke (19:1-10)

At that time Jesus was passing through Jericho. There was a man there named Zaccheus, the chief tax collector and a wealthy man. He was trying to see what Jesus was like, but being small of stature, was unable to do so because of the crowd. He first ran on in front, then climbed a sycamore tree which was along Jesus' route, in order to see him. When Jesus came to the spot he looked up and said, "Zaccheus, hurry down. I mean to stay at your house today." He quickly descended, and welcomed him with delight. When this was observed, everyone began to murmur, "He has gone to a sinner's house as a guest." Zaccheus stood his ground and said to the Lord: "I give half my belongings, Lord, to the poor. If I have defrauded anyone in the least, I pay him back four-fold." Jesus said to him: "Today salvation has come to this house, for this is what it means to be a son of Abraham. The Son of Man has come to search out and save what was lost."



UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC FOUNDATION OF SASKATCHEWAN GRANT FUND PROGRAM – 2020 DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS

The Ukrainian Catholic Foundation Grant Fund was established from the proceeds of sale of the Sheptytsky Institute building. The investment income earned on this fund is distributed to Parishes/Missions or Eparchial Organizations for various initiatives to assist them in becoming "Vibrant Parishes/Missions/Organizations" within the Eparchy.

The amount of funds available for distribution in 2020 was **\$71,150.00**. The distribution of the Grant Fund was done in two parts:


- 1) **\$54,000.00** distributed as COVID-19 financial assistance to Parishes in the Eparchy with a resident priest(s) or deacons(s).
- 2) **\$17,150.00** distributed to Parishes that made application requesting funds from the Grant Fund for various Parish projects.

Dweller in the Desert

The Desert Fathers tell a story about some robbers who entered a monastery and said to one of the monks, "Give us everything you have." The monk did not resist. The robbers took everything they could find in the room and then departed. They didn't get far before the old monk came running after them. The old monk had discovered something they had left behind and said, "here, my children, take this as well, for material possessions mean nothing to me." Amazed by this, the robbers returned everything they had taken and repented saying, "Truly, this is a man of God!"

On January 17th we celebrate the feast of Saint Anthony the Great, another "man of God" who gave away all his possession. He was born into nobility and wealth in Egypt in the third century but upon the death of his parents, gave away all his possession to the poor. Often referred to as the Father of Monasticism, he withdrew to the desert to live the life of a monk for the next eighty-five years.

Although he had no formal education, he was revered as a teacher of teachers and counselor of counselors. On one occasion, some philosophers challenged him on his lack of credentials. Anthony replied, "Which is better: good sense or book learning?" The shamed philosophers realized that they had only book learning, while Anthony had real understanding.

Saint Anthony died at the age of 105 around the year 356. His teachings and way of life are still revered today.
