This Tuesday afternoon, March 16, 2021 the province of Saskatchewan, along with Dr. Saqib Shahab, Saskatchewan's Chief Medical Health Officer, announced a revised public

health order for Regina and District.

Act to Reduce COVID-19 Transmission in Regina

There is an elevated risk of COVID-19 in Regina due to community transmission of variants of concern.

It is recommended that Regina and area residents - particularly those over age 50 - should not consider increasing their household bubbles to include 2-3 households up to 10 people. They should consider remaining with their current household only.

While worship services throughout the province will be able to expand to 30 per cent of capacity or 150 people, whichever is the lesser number starting March 19, places of worship in Regina and adjacent communities will remain at the current capacity level which is a maximum of 30 individuals, with required physical distancing and masking guidelines. This will remain in effect until April 5, 2021 and will be evaluated at that time.

The adjacent communities include: Belle Plaine, Pense, Grand Coulee, Lumsden Beach, Regina Beach, Craven, Lumsden, Edenwold, Pilot Butte, White City, Balgonie, Kronau, Davin, Gray and Riceton.

All residents of Regina, those who work in Regina and area and those who are planning travel to the region, are asked to abide by all best personal protective measures at this time to avoid further restrictions. Minimize the risk in the city and throughout the region.

- \* Wear your mask in all public places including all workplaces
- \* Wash non-medical masks daily
- \* Maintain physical distancing
- \* Wash your hands frequently

- \* Reduce activities outside of your home. Order take-out or curbside pick-up. If you are able to work from home, work from home at this time.
  - \* Avoid all unnecessary travel to and from Regina

First Antiphon: p, 21 "Bless the Lord..." (First Psalm of Typica)

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and let all that is within me bless His Holy name. Blessed are You, O Lord.

### Third Antiphon: p, 27 "Remember us..." (The Beatitudes)

Remember us, O Lord, in Your kingdom.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the pure of heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

### **EPISTLE:** A reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews (9:11-14)

Brothers and Sisters! When Christ came as high priest of the good things which have come to be, he entered once for all into the sanctuary passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation. He entered, not with the blood of goats and calves, but with his own blood, and achieved eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifers ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal spirit offered himself up unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God!

**ALLELUIA VERSES:** God gives me vindication, and has subdued peoples under me. Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to His posterity forever.

# **GOSPEL: Mark (10:32-45)**

At that time, Jesus taking the twelve aside once more, began to tell them what was going to happen to him. "We are on our way up to Jerusalem, where the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes. They will condemn him to death and hand him over to the Gentiles, who will mock him and spit at him, flog him, and finally kill him. But three days later he will rise. Zebedee's sons, James and John, approached him, "Teacher," they said, "we want you to grant our request." "What is it?" he asked. They replied, "See to it that we sit, one at your right and the other at your left, when you come into your glory." Jesus told them, "You do not know what your are asking. Can you drink the cup I shall drink or be baptized in the same bath of pain as I?" "We can," they told him. Jesus said in response, "From the cup I drink of you shall drink; the bath I am immersed in you shall share. But as for sitting at my right or my left, that is not mine to give, it is

for those to whom it has been reserved." The other ten, on hearing this, became indignant at James and John. Jesus called them together and said to them: "You know how among the Gentiles those who seem to exercise authority lord it over them; their great ones make their importance felt. It cannot be like that with you. Anyone among you who aspires to greatness must serve the rest; whoever wants to rank first among you must serve the needs of all. The Son of Man has not come to be served but to serve -- to give his life in ransom for the many."





WITH THE PRAYER OF ST. EPHEM


O Lord and Master of my life, Keep from me the spirit of indifference and discouragement, Lust of power and idle chatter. (Prostration)

Instead, grant to me Your servant, the spirit of wholeness of being, humble-mindedness, patience and love. (Prostration)

O Lord and King, Grant me the grace to be aware of my sins, and not to judge my neighbour, For You are blessed, now and forever and ever. (Prostration)

#### ANOTHER TRIP TO JERUSALEM

"Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and to the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and deliver Him to the Gentiles; and they will mock Him, and scourge Him, and spit on Him, and kill Him. And on the third day He will rise again" (Mark 10:33-34).



As Lent draws to a close, we turn our eyes to Jerusalem where the Lord will undergo His life-giving passion and death for us.

On this 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent the Church also remembers another trip to Jerusalem: one that occurred some 300 years after Christ. According to the life written by St. Sophronios, Patriarch of Jerusalem in the seventh century, Mary the Egyptian was a runaway teenager who drifted into a fast lifestyle in Alexandria living in part on the proceeds of the sexual favors she dispensed.

When she was 29 Mary attached herself to a group going on pil-grimage to the Holy Land. She went, not out of piety, but to meet others devoted to the same lifestyle. According to Sophronios, she never lacked for companions both on the journey and when she arrived in the Holy City.

One day, curiosity prompted her to follow some pilgrims to the Anastasis, the church built over Christ's tomb. She found herself

unable to enter, resisted by an unseen force. Believing that this was because of her wild way of life, she was struck with remorse. She prayed before an icon of the Mother of God in the court-yard, asking for forgiveness and vowing to abandon the world and its pleasures. Returning to the church door she found herself now able to enter.

Returning to give thanks before the icon, Mary heard a voice promising, "If you cross the Jordan, you will find glorious rest/ true peace." After confessing and receiving Communion, she went into the desert where she remained a hermit for the rest of her life.

The image of this extraordinary repentance and commitment to asceticism is held up to the Church as an encouragement to enter wholeheartedly into the remainder of the Fast and the Great Week which follows (*adopted from royaldoors.net*).

### The Annunciation

In these days of Lenten observance the solemnity of our Lord's Annunciation provides us with a welcome interlude, so that men who are wearied by bodily affliction may be revived by spiritual joy, and men brought low by the grief of repentance may be consoled by the annunciation of him who takes away the sins of the world. For so it is written: "Grief in a man's heart will bring him low and he will be gladdened by a good word." Truly it is a good word, a trustworthy word and worthy of all acceptance, the glad tidings of our salvation which the angel sent by God announced to Mary today. Day unto day announced the joy; the angel brought to the Virgin the joyful word concerning the incarnation of the Word. That utterance, while it promises the Virgin a Son, promises the guilty forgiveness, prisoners redemption, captives liberty, and the buried life. That word, while it proclaims the

kingdom of the Son, announces also the glory of the just, strikes fear into hell, gladdens the heavens, and seems to have increased the perfection of the angels by knowledge of mysteries and by new kinds of joy. Who then is not gladdened by that word in his affliction? Who is not consoled by that utterance in his humility?

A good word indeed and consoling is your almighty Word, Lord, which today has come from a royal throne into the Virgin's womb. In it also he has made for himself a royal throne in which, although he sits even now as a king in the heavens surrounded by a host of angels, he is nonetheless the comforter of those who grieve on earth.
