This Tuesday afternoon, March 16, 2021 the province of Saskatchewan, along with Dr. Saqib Shahab, Saskatchewan's Chief Medical Health Officer, announced a revised public

health order for Regina and District.

Act to Reduce COVID-19 Transmission in Regina

There is an elevated risk of COVID-19 in Regina due to community transmission of variants of concern.

It is recommended that Regina and area residents - particularly those over age 50 - should not consider increasing their household bubbles to include 2-3 households up to 10 people. They should consider remaining with their current household only.

While worship services throughout the province will be able to expand to 30 per cent of capacity or 150 people, whichever is the lesser number starting March 19, places of worship in Regina and adjacent communities will remain at the current capacity level which is a maximum of 30 individuals, with required physical distancing and masking guidelines. This will remain in effect until April 5, 2021 and will be evaluated at that time.

The adjacent communities include: Belle Plaine, Pense, Grand Coulee, Lumsden Beach, Regina Beach, Craven, Lumsden, Edenwold, Pilot Butte, White City, Balgonie, Kronau, Davin, Gray and Riceton.

All residents of Regina, those who work in Regina and area and those who are planning travel to the region, are asked to abide by all best personal protective measures at this time to avoid further restrictions. Minimize the risk in the city and throughout the region.

- * Wear your mask in all public places including all workplaces
- * Wash non-medical masks daily
- * Maintain physical distancing
- * Wash your hands frequently

- * Reduce activities outside of your home. Order take-out or curbside pick-up. If you are able to work from home, work from home at this time.
 - * Avoid all unnecessary travel to and from Regina
- * The Provincial government has asked that anyone who is scheduled to have a vaccine within a few days of a religious service, not to go to worship that day and to wait until after they have received the vaccine, especially those who are over 60.

Please note: Due to the revised Public Health order regarding places of worship, St. Athanasius Church will allow 30 people to attend services as per Public Health Act of Saskatchewan. **Please continue to register for all services.**

GOSPEL: John (12:1-18)

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the village of Lazarus whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they gave him a banquet, at which Martha served. Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary brought a pound of costly perfume made from genuine aromatic nard, with which she anointed Jesus' feet. Then she dried his feet with her hair, and the house was filled with the ointment's fragrance. Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one about to hand him over), protested: "Why was not this perfume sold? It could have brought three hundred silver pieces, and the money, could have been given to the poor." (He did not say this out of concern for the poor, but because he was a thief. He held the purse, and used to help himself to what was deposited there.) To this Jesus replied: "Leave her alone. Let her keep it against the day they prepare me for

burial. The poor you always have with you, but me you will not always have." The great crowd of Jews discovered he was there and came out, not only because of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. The fact was, the chief priests planned to kill Lazarus too, because many Jews were going over to Jesus and believing him on account of Lazarus. The next day the great crowd that had come for the feast heard that Jesus was to enter Jerusalem, so they got palm branches and came out to meet him. They kept shouting: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the King of Israel!" Jesus found a donkey and mounted it, in accord with Scripture: "Fear not, O daughter of Zion! Your king approaches you on a donkey's colt." (At first, the disciples did not understand all this, but after Jesus was glorified they recalled that the people had done to him precisely what had been written about him.) The crowd that was present when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead kept testifying to it. The crowd came out to meet him because they had heard he had performed this sign.

Instead of 'It is truly right': O my soul, extol the Lord, who sat on a donkey. God the Lord has appeared to us; let us celebrate the feast, and let us rejoice and extol Christ. With palms and branches in hand let us raise our voices to Him in praise, saying: "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord* our Savior."

COMMUNION HYMN: Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, the Lord is God and has appeared to us. Alleluia! Alleluia!



Easter Food Basket

It is traditional that during the Great Fast (Lent), the faithful fast and abstain from meat and dairy products as much as possible. To show their joy and gratitude at the end of this time of fasting, people take to Church baskets of food which are to be blessed and then consumed on Easter morning to "break-fast". The traditional Ukrainian Easter morning breakfast of hard-boiled eggs, various meats, sau-

sages and ham, butter, decorative paska, salt, horseradish, and cheese is a very special treat. This meal is very much looked forward to, especially in light of the symbolism of the foods that are consumed. In the Ukrainian tradition, the Easter basket foods symbolize:

Paska — Christ, Our Bread of Life

Eggs — New Life and the Resurrection of Christ

Horseradish — The Passion of Christ

Bacon — God's Mercy

Cheese — the moderation that Christians should show in all things

Salt — The duty of Christians to others

Ham — The great Joy and abundance of Easter

Butter — The goodness of Christ

Kovbasa — God's favor and generosity

Palm Sunday



The Holy Week before Easter begins with Palm Sunday, also known as Willow Sunday (Flowery Sunday). In the liturgical hymns of Palm Sunday, we sing of the children of Jerusalem, who greeted Christ as King even though the Pharisees and scribes refused to accept Him: "O, evil and adulterous generation, why have you treated your Lord so faithlessly? … Why have you rejected the prophet's words which proclaim him? Your own

children sang to your shame today: 'Hosanna to the son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

Just as the people greeted Christ with branches from trees, so Christians also greet Christ with "palms of virtue" as he enters upon his voluntary Passion.

This day commemorates the triumphant entrance of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem,

when so many proclaimed Him "King" and placed palm branches on the ground in the path of His travel. In Ukraine, it was often very difficult to obtain palms for this day, so pussy willow branches were substituted. The pussy willow was one of the first trees to show signs of early spring life, so its branches were selected as the ones to be blessed at Sunday services and distributed to the faithful. After Palm Sunday services, it was customary for Ukrainians exiting church to gently tap each other with the blessed pussy willow branches.



But the tapping of friends with the pussy willow branches was actually a wish for good preparation for Easter time, a wish for good health, wealth and happiness. The tapping was usually accompanied by the phrase: "Не я б'ю – верба б'є, за тиждень – Великдень!" "The willow is hitting, I'm not hitting, one week from today, it will be Easter" The blessed willow branches were then taken home and were placed in front of, behind or above holy pictures in the home. These branches would replace the branches that had been placed the previous year. The branches which were taken down were carefully burned.
