The Faith Leaders' Working Group met with our government liaisons again today. As you know, the **Saskatchewan Re-opening Roadmap will begin Step 1 on Sunday May 30**. We have sought clarification on a number of details raised by you or another faith leader. Here is a summary of the upcoming changes:

In Step 1, beginning Sunday, May 30:

- maximum capacity of a place of worship will be increased to 30% of seating capacity, with a maximum of 150 people in the entire facility.
- 2 metre distancing, masking, sanitizing, and contact tracing will continue to be required.
- sharing food or drink is prohibited in Step 1.
- other non-worship gatherings will be allowed to a maximum of **30 people**.
- non-worship gatherings held concurrently with a worship service are allowed but the total number of people in the worship service and additional gathering may not exceed 150 people.
- non-essential travel is not recommended outside Saskatchewan.

In Step 2, beginning June 20, there will be few changes affecting places of worship:

- maximum capacity will remain 30% of seating capacity, with a maximum of 150 people in the entire facility.
- 2 metre distancing, masking, sanitizing, and contact tracing will continue to be required.
- sharing food or drink is prohibited in Step 2.
- other non-worship gatherings will be allowed to a maximum of 150 people.
- non-worship gatherings held concurrently with a worship service are allowed but the total number of people in the worship service and additional gathering may not exceed 150 people.
- non-essential travel is not recommended outside Saskatchewan.

Step 3 is anticipated in mid-July. In Step 3 most restrictions will be lifted. There will be no limits on capacity, food and drink will be permitted, physical distancing and contact tracing will not be required. It is expected that masks and sanitizing will be advised for some time, but the public health emergency will end, and the public health orders will be lifted soon after Step 3 begins.

Due to the continuing high infection rates in both Alberta and Manitoba, travel will not be recommended even in Step 3. The entire SK Roadmap is continuent on the continuing decline in infection rates. Please continue to cooperate with public health authorities and encourage vaccination.

Health officials are still considering when large gatherings such as conferences and sporting events will be able to resume. Further advice will be provided in the coming weeks.

As the province is easing the restrictions for churches in the Reopen plan, St. Athanasius will be moving to the following starting Sunday May 30, 2021.

• A maximum of 55 people will be allowed in three groups of 1 or 2 in the available pews to maintain the distancing required.

- All parishioners MUST continue to pre-register for all Liturgies by contacting Father Vasyl for weekdays(306-519-8008) or Len Markewich for Sunday, June 27th (306-584-3206).
- If you are on the edge of a pew please step into the aisle or move to the centre to avoid people having to step over one another.
- All seating is on the main floor as the choir loft remains closed to the public.
- As restrictions continue to change, we will update you further.

Please note: Due to the revised Public Health order regarding places of worship, St. Athanasius Church will allow 55 people to attend services as per Public Health Act of Saskatchewan. Also, please remember there is to be no gathering or socializing in the church fover after services. Please continue to register for all services.

SUNDAY LITURGIES: If you wish to attend Liturgy on Sunday, June 27th please contact Len Markewich, 306-584-3206, to confirm your attendance (preferably by Noon on Saturday). This is a reminder that this process must be followed for **EACH** Sunday. You can leave a message for Len, if he is not home, and he will confirm whether or not there is space for you. Thank you for your cooperation.

Brothers & Sisters! Freed from your sin, you became slaves of justice. (I use the following example from human affairs because of your weak human nature.) Just as formerly you enslaved your bodies to impurity and licentiousness for their degradation, make them now the servants of justice for your sanctification. When you were slaves of sin, you had freedom from justice. What benefit did you then enjoy? Things you are now ashamed of, all of them tending toward death. But now that you are freed from sin and have become slaves of God, your benefit is sanctification as you tend toward eternal life. The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

ALLELUIA VERSE: In You, O Lord, have I hoped that I may not be put to shame for ever.

Be a protector unto me, O God, and a house of refuge to save me.

GOSPEL: (Matthew 8:5-13)

At that time as Jesus entered Capernaum, a centurion approached him with this request: "Sir, my serving boy is at home in bed paralyzed, suffering painfully." He said to him, "I will come and cure him." "Sir," the centurion said in reply, "I am not worthy to have you under my roof. Just give an order and my boy will get better. I am a man under authority myself and I have troops assigned to me. If I give one man the order, 'Dismissed,' off he goes. If I say to another, 'Come here,' he comes. If I tell my slave, 'Do this,' he does it." Jesus showed amazement on hearing this and remarked to his followers, "I assure you, I have never found this much faith in Israel. Mark what I say! Many will come from the east and the west and will find a place at the banquet in the kingdom of God with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, while the natural heirs of the kingdom will be driven out into the dark. Wailing will be heard there, and the grinding of teeth." To the centurion Jesus said, "Go home. It shall be done because you trusted." That very moment the boy got better.

Pope Francis appoints Archbishop Jurkovič New Nuncio to Canada



His Excellency Archbishop Ivan Jurkovič was born on June 10, 1952, in Banja Loka, Kočevje, Slovenia.

On June 29, 1977, he was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Ljubljana (Slovenia). He is a graduate from the Faculty of Theology in Ljubljana. Between 1980 and 1984 he completed his studies in Canon Law at the Pontifical Lateran University in Rome and at the Pontifical Ecclesiastical Academy. He holds a Doctorate in Canon Law.

On May 1, 1984, he joined the diplomatic service of the Holy See serving in the following capacities and locations:

1984-1988 Secretary of the Apostolic Nunciature to Korea;

1988-1992 Counsellor of the Apostolic Nunciature to Colombia; 1992-1995 Counsellor of the Representation of the Holy See to the Russian Federation;

1996-2001 Counsellor at the Section for Relations with States of the Secretariat of State of the Holy See in Vatican City.

On October 6, 2001, Msgr. Jurkovič received Episcopal Consecration and was appointed Titular Archbishop of Corbavia. Following the same, he served in the following missions:

2001-2004 Apostolic Nuncio to Belarus (appointed July 27, 2001);

2004-2011 Apostolic Nuncio to Ukraine (appointed April 22, 2004);

2011-2016 Apostolic Nuncio to the Russian Federation (appointed February 2011). At same time, Apostolic Nuncio in Uzbekistan (appointed July 22, 2011);

2016-2021 Permanent Observer of the Holy See to the Office of the United Nations and Other International Organizations in Geneva, Permanent Observer to the World Trade Organization (WTO), and also Representative of the Holy See to the International Organization for Migrantion (IOM) (appointed February 13, 2016).

The Holy Father appointed Archbishop Jurkovič Apostolic Nuncio to Canada on June 5, 2021. Archbishop Jurkovič's mother tongue is Slovenian, however, he is likewise well versed in Italian, Spanish, English, Russian, German, French, Serbian, Croatian and Ukrainian.

Icon of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist and Forerunner



Jesus and John, Mary, Elizabeth and Zechariah

We ought not be so astonished that John merited such grace in his birth. For the precursor and forerunner of Christ ought to have had something similar to the birth of the Lord, the Savior.

Indeed, the Lord was begotten of a virgin and John of a sterile woman, the one of an unstained girl and the other of an already exhausted old woman. John's birth, then, also has something of the glorious and the wondrous. Although it would seem to be less noble for a matron to give birth than for a virgin to give birth, yet as we look up to Mary for having given birth as a virgin we also wonder at Elizabeth for having done so as an old woman.

Indeed, I think that this fact contains a certain mystery. John, who was a figure of the Old Testament, should have been born of the already cold blood of an old woman, while the Lord,

who would preach the gospel of the kingdom of heaven, came forth from a woman in the flower of glowing youth. Mary, conscious of her virginity, marvels at the fruit hidden in her belly, while Elizabeth, conscious of her old age, blushes that her womb is heavy with the one she has conceived. Thus the Evangelist says, "She hid herself for five months." How wonderful it is, though, that the same archangel Gabriel performs an office with respect to each birth! He comforts the unbelieving Zechariah and encourages the believing Mary. He lost his voice because he doubted. But she, because she believed immediately, conceived the saving Word.

From a Sermon of St. Maximus of Turin
