**EPISTLE:** A reading from the Holy Apostle Paul to the Galatians (1:11-19)

Brothers and Sisters: I assure you, the gospel I proclaimed to you is no mere human invention. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I schooled in it. It came by revelation from Jesus Christ. You have heard, I know, the story of my former way of life in Judaism. You know that I went to extremes in persecuting the Church of God and tried to destroy it; I made progress in Jewish observance far beyond most of my contemporaries, in my excess of zeal to live out all the traditions of my ancestors. But the time came when he who had set me apart before I was born and called me by his favor chose to reveal his Son to me, that I might spread among the Gentiles the good tidings concerning him. Immediately, without seeking human advisers or even going to Jerusalem to see those who were apostles before me, I went off to Arabia; later I returned to Damascus. Three years after that I went up to Jerusalem to get to know Cephas,

with whom I stayed fifteen days. I did not meet any other apostles except James, the brother of the Lord.

ALLELUIA VERSE: Remember, O Lord, for David all his anxious care. How he swore to the Lord, vowed to the Mighty One of Jacob.

GOSPEL: Matthew 2:13-23

After the wise men had left, the angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph with the command: "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you otherwise. Herod is searching for the child to destroy him." Joseph got up and took the child and his mother and left that night for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod, to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I have called my son." Once Herod realized that he had been deceived by the wise men, he became furious. He ordered the massacre of all the boys two years old and under in Bethlehem and its environs, making his calculations on the basis of the date he had learned from the wise men. What was said through Jeremiah the prophet was then fulfilled: "A cry was heard at Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentations: Rachel bewailing her children; no comfort for her, since they are no more." But after Herod's death, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt with the command: "Get up, take the child and his mother, and set out for the land of Israel. Those who had designs on the life of the child are dead." He got up, took the child and his mother, and returned to the land of Israel. He heard however, that Archelaus had succeeded his father Herod as king of Judea, and he was afraid to go back there. Instead, because of a warning received in a dream, Joseph went to the region of Galilee. There he settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way what was said through the prophet was fulfilled: "He shall be called a Nazorean."

INSTEAD OF 'It Is Truly Right...': *Rejoice, O my soul, for in a cave was born Christ the King.* A strange and incredible mystery, I behold the cave becomes heaven, The Virgin becomes the throne of the cherubim. The manger becomes the place where lies the unplaceable Christ God. To Him we sing praises.

COMMUNION HYMN: Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest. Exult, you just, in the Lord; praise from the upright is fitting. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

INSTEAD OF "Blessed is He who comes..., "We have seen the true light...", and "Blessed be the name...": The whole universe is today filled with joy, for Christ is born of a Virgin!

Are you in grades 7-12 and are looking to attend a 24-hour Lock-in Retreat?



Dear Parishioners-Members of the Eparchy of Saskatoon:

1. Corrected interpretations:

The following activities in a place of worship are EX-EMPT from the proof of vaccination requirement:

Corrected interpretations for activities in a place of worship that are **EXEMPT** from the proof of vaccination requirement.

- Wedding receptions or funeral luncheons following the event are considered as an extension of the wedding ceremony or funeral service and are therefore also exempt.
- AA and other 12 step programs are considered essential due to the well-being of the individuals and so are exempt from proof of vaccination in any facility. These also include a spiritual component and so may be included under the exemption granted to places of worship.
- Other examples where proof of vaccination in a place of worship is not required include, but is not limited to: Mental Health & Addictions; Victim Services; Religiously-affiliated charitable organizations; At Risk Youth Groups; etc.
- Christmas concerts and pageants are considered an extension of the worship service and so are exempt, even when held at a time separated from worship. The restriction in 2(c)(vii)(5) that applies to concert venues has been interpreted to only refer to large public venues.
- Meetings of the faith community for church governance, planning, etc..., however remote from the act of worship. All activities related to the maintenance and support of the faith community are deemed to be religious activity exempt from the proof of vaccination requirement.

It should be noted that key terms such as "worship", "religious activity", and "essential service" are not defined in the public health order.

2. Private gatherings:

Proof of vaccination does not apply to private gatherings anywhere, whether in a private home, a place of worship, or a rented venue such as a hotel, see 3(a)(ix). "Private gathering" is not defined in the health order but is to be understood as any gathering to which the public is not invited, whether explicit invitations were issued or not. For example, a service club meeting which is only open to members. This is a point where the self-understanding of faith communities may conflict with the government definitions. In this sense, the government appears to be interpreting much of the religious activity outside of worship to be private gatherings.

If a place of worship is being used as a banquet facility for an event open to the public, proof of vaccination or negative test would be required. If the event is not open to the public (i.e. a wedding reception to which invitations are issued) proof of vaccination is not required.

3. Caveat emptor: proceed with caution

The changes described here are matters of interpretation provided by our government liaison. These are not explicitly found in the public health order. We are advised that religious activities within a place of worship will be interpreted quite broadly. As such, we are able to hold gatherings for church governance, planning, etc... without proof of vaccination.

# PASTORAL LETTER FROM THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF CANADA ON THE OCCASION OF THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD 2021-2022

To the Reverend Clergy, Monastics, Seminarians and Laity of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in Canada:

#### Christ is Born! Let Us Glorify Him!

Dearly Beloved in Christ!

"The earth offers a cave to the Inaccessible." Kontakion of the Nativity

The *Kontakion* of the Nativity of the Lord heralds a true paradox. It reminds us of the sharp contrasts we find in the human condition. The Indescribable, Eternal and Inaccessible God, is humbly born in a cave. The Incarnation of the Son of God comes about in a place barely fit for animals. Today, we find it hard to believe that any person could be born outside of a hospital or a home, and yet the Creator of the Universe embraces humanity in the midst of inhospitable indignity.

In this world we don't have to look far to find human indignity. Human tragedy is all around us. Physical, emotional and spiritual injustice is the content of many news stories. And in the midst of these stories often there is a ray of light in the darkness, a person who shines and restores our hope in human dignity. Worldwide, in Ukraine, or in our own homes in Canada, the Holy Spirit is waiting to break through to others with good news. Each of us would do well to ask God that question, "Lord, how do you want to use me in sharing this news?"


The good news is that despite our hearts being similar in some ways to the inhospitable cave, Jesus wants to dwell there. Our openness to this profound mystery requires quiet time for prayer far from distractions, away from the numerous demands that contemporary society places on our attention. In the stillness of our hearts God will speak. God will give each of us the grace to say "yes" together with the Holy Family. Jesus is born in the manger of a humble heart filled with love. He is born in every thought and action that honours the Heavenly Father and hearts that treat those created in His image with dignity. This is the good news we share on this Feast. And by praying together as families and participating in the Holy Mysteries, especially in the Eucharist, we are lifted up and confirmed as beloved children of God.

Therefore, let us intercede in prayer and perhaps take positive steps toward solutions to the many inhumane things we encounter in life. Let us learn from St. Joseph as Jesus did, developing a sense of obedience to His Heavenly Father, through the example of Joseph's obedience to God. Let us learn from Mary, the Mother of God, as Jesus did, developing a sense of profound love and compassion through his earthly experience of a mother's love. Let us allow the Christ in us to be a light of wisdom and compassion to others. And as our society today continues to struggle with the COVID pandemic, let us always be mindful of the wellbeing of others.



#### The Holy Family Flees to Egypt

But why was the Christ child sent into Egypt? The text makes this clear: He was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt have I called my son." From that point onward we see that the hope of salvation would be proclaimed to the whole world. Babylon and Egypt represent the whole world. Even when they were engulfed in ungodliness, God signified that He intended to correct and amend both Babylon and Egypt. God wanted humanity to expect his bounteous gifts the world over. So, he called from Babylon the Wise Men and sent to Egypt the Holy Family. Besides what I have said, there is another lesson also to be learned, which tends powerfully toward true self-constraint in us. We are warned from the beginning to look out for temptations and plots. And we see this even when He came in swaddling clothes. Thus, you see even at His birth a tyrant raging, a flight ensuing and a departure beyond the border. For it was because of no crime that His family was exiled into the land of Egypt.

Similarly, you yourself need not be troubled if you are suffering countless dangers. Do not expect to be celebrated or crowned promptly for your troubles. Instead, you may keep in mind the long-suffering example of the mother of the Child, bearing all things nobly, knowing that such a fugitive life is consistent with the ordering of spiritual things. You are sharing the kind of labor Mary herself shared. So did the Magi. They both were willing to retire secretly in the humiliating role of fugitive.
