EASTER SUNDAY - The Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ

NOTE: Please remember that from Resurrection Sunday up to Ascension Thursday, we stand to pray. Note also that from Easter Sunday to Ascension Thursday, at daily Liturgies, the Sunday antiphons are recited and the tropar, kondak, etc. are read from the preceding Sunday bulletin. The Epistle and Gospel are of the day.

THIRD ANTIPHON: Christ is risen from the dead, by death He conquered death, and to those in the graves He granted life.

TROPAR: Christ is risen from the dead, trampling death by death, and to those in the tombs giving life.

As smoke vanishes, let them vanish, as wax melts from the presence of fire.

TROPAR: Christ is risen from the dead....

So let sinners perish from the presence of God but let the righteous rejoice.

TROPAR: Christ is risen from the dead....

AT THE LITTLE ENTRANCE: In assemblies bless God, the Lord, you who spring from Israel.

TROPAR: Christ is risen from the dead....

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and for ever and ever. Amen!

KONDAK (Tone 8): Though You went down to the grave, immortal Lord, You destroyed the power of Hades and rose victorious, Christ our God. You who said "Rejoice" to the myrrhbearing women, give peace to Your apostles and offer resurrection to the fallen.

INSTEAD OF 'Holy God...': All you, who have been baptized into Christ, have put on Christ. Alleluia!

PROKIMEN (Tone 8): This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. VERSE: Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, his love is everlasting.

EPISTLE: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (1:1-8)

In my first account, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up to heaven, having first instructed the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit. In the time after his suffering he showed them in many convincing ways that he was alive, appearing to them over the course of forty days and speaking to them about the reign of God.

On one occasion when he met with them he told them not to leave Jerusalem: "Wait, rather, for the fulfillment of my Father's promise, of which you have heard me speak. John baptized with water, but within a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." While they were with him they asked, "Lord, are you going to restore the rule to Israel now?" His answer was: "The exact time it is not yours to know. The Father has reserved that to himself. You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes down on you; then you are to be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, yes, even to the ends of the earth."

ALLELUIA VERSES: Rise, take pity on Zion.

The Lord has looked down on earth from heaven.

GOSPEL: John 1:1-17

In the beginning was the Word; and the Word was in God's presence, and the Word was God. He was present to God in the beginning, through him all things came into being, and apart from him nothing came to be.

Whatever came to be in him, found life, life for the light of men. The light shines on in darkness, a darkness that did not overcome it.

There was a man named John sent by God, who came as a witness to testify to the light, so that through him all men might believe.

But only to testify to the light, for he himself was not the light. The real light which gives light to every man was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and through him the world was made, yet the world did not know who he was. To his own he came, yet his own did not accept him.

Any who did accept him he empowered to become children of God. These are they who believe in his name.

Begotten not by blood, nor by carnal desire, nor by man's willing it, but by God.

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we have seen his glory; the glory of an only Son coming from the Father, filled with enduring love.

John testified to him by proclaiming: "This is he of whom I said, The one who comes after me ranks ahead of me, for he was before me."

Of his fullness we have all had a share -- love following upon love.

For while the law was given through Moses, this enduring love came through Jesus Christ.

INSTEAD OF 'It is truly right...': The Angel greeted You O full of grace, O purest virgin rejoice and again I say rejoice. Your Son has risen from the tomb on the third day, and has raised all who were dead. O mankind rejoice!

Shine O Shine, O new Jerusalem for the glory of the Lord has surrounded you; be happy now and rejoice O Zion. And you pure Mother of God, exalt and rejoice in the Resurrection of Him who was born of you.



Holy Pascha

Many indeed are the wonders of that time: God crucified; the sun darkened and again rekindled, for created things also had to suffer with the Creator; the veil split; blood and water pouring from His side, the first as human, the second as above the human; the earth shaken, rocks broken in pieces for the sake of the Rock; dead people raised to bring faith in the completion of the universal resurrection; the signs at the tomb and after the tomb. Who can adequately sing their praise? Yet none is like the wonder of my salvation: a few drops of blood recreate the whole world and become for all human beings like a curdling agent for milk, binding and drawing us together into one.

But, 0 Pascha, great and holy and purifier of all the world, I will speak to you as to a living being. 0 Word of God and light and life and wisdom and power! For I rejoice in all your names. 0 offspring and movement and imprint of the Great Mind! Apprehended as Word and contemplated as human, you uphold all things, biding them by the word of your power! Accept now this discourse, not as first fruits but perhaps as a completion of the fruit we offer, as a thank-offering and at the same time a supplication, that we may suffer nothing beyond the necessary and sacred things pertaining to us; and stop the body's tyranny over us - you see, Lord, how great it is and burden-some; or what you decree, if we are to be purified by you. But if we are to be released worthily as we desire, and received in the heavenly tabernacle, perhaps also there we will make acceptable offerings to you on your holy altar, 0 Father and Word and Holy Spirit, for to you belong all glory, honor and sovereignty to the age of ages. Amen.







"100 Mile Bicycle Trek Fundraiser" for Orphan Children of Ukraine

To support the orphan children of Ukraine and to commemorate the "100 years" of the Saskatchewan Knights of Columbus in the province, the Knights of Columbus Bishop Budka Council #5914 of St. Basil's Ukrainian Catholic Church, along with their volunteers and sponsors will be hosting the "100 mile bicycle trek fundraising project".

When: Long Weekend- Two Days- Saturday May 21st(first 50 miles) and Sunday May 22nd, 2022 (last 50 miles).

Where: From Regina (8 am pre-ride start-off/registration at Tim Horton's Harbor Landing, Regina) on Highway #1 to Moose Jaw, Sk. then return next day from Moose Jaw (8 am pre-ride start-off at Tim Horton's downtown), back to Regina. The route is approximately 100 miles long. Snacks and beverages will be provided on route. Participants are responsible for their own accommodations and meals.

How: By bicycle or possible alternate with priority on having a highway security escort.

Participants: Knights of Columbus volunteers, bicycle club riders, athletic youth, wheelchair athletes (to assist in the initial launch of this trek), and law enforcement personnel. Everyone is welcome to participate.

Donations: All donations and proceeds will be given to the Sisters of St. Joseph's (Registered Charity

Saskatoon) to distribute to orphan children of Ukraine. All <u>donation payments</u> (cash, cheque, e-payments) can be made on a per mile basis or lump sum to the <u>St. Basil's Ukrainian Catholic Church</u> @ 1747 Toronto Street, Regina. Sask. S4P 1M5 or <u>e-payment transfer</u> to <u>seredam@sasktel.net</u> for an Income Tax Receipt.
