EPISTLE: A reading from the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (4: 9-16)

Brothers and Sisters! God has put us apostles at the end of the line, like men doomed to die in the arena. We have become a spectacle to the universe, to angels and men alike. We are fools on Christ's account. Ah, but in Christ you are wise! We are the weak ones, you the strong! They honor you, while they sneer at us! Up to this very hour we go hungry and thirsty, poorly clad, roughly treated, wandering about homeless. We work hard at manual labor. When we are insulted we respond with a blessing. Persecution comes our way; we bear it patiently. We are slandered, and we try conciliation. We have become the world's refuse, the scum of all; that is the present state of affairs. I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children. Granted you have ten thousand guardians in Christ, you have only one father. It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me.

GOSPEL: Matthew 17:14-23

At that time a man come up to Jesus and knelt before him. "Lord," he said, "take pity on my son, who is demented and in a serious condition. For example, he often falls into the fire and frequently into the water. I have brought him to your disciples but they could not cure him." In reply Jesus said: "What an unbelieving and perverse lot you are! How long must I remain with you? How long can I endure you? Bring him here to me!" Then Jesus reprimanded him, and the demon came out of him. That very moment the boy was cured. The disciples approached Jesus at that point and asked him privately, "Why could we not expel it?" "Because you have so little trust," he told them. "I assure you, if you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you would be able to say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it would move. Nothing would be impossible for you. This kind does not leave but by prayer and fasting." When they met again in Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men who will put him to death, and he will be raised up on the third day."

Biography: Fr. Juan Diego Sutherland

He has served as local superior, director of San Benito Jose medical clinic in Comayagua, Honduras, as well as director of St. Benedict's outreach in Fort Worth, TX, and prison Chaplain in Matagalpa, Nicaragua.

Fr. Juan Diego grew up in Canada. Upon completion of his studies at St. Joseph's Seminary, Dunwoodie, NY, in 2007, he was ordained to the priesthood at St. Patricks Cathedral, NY.

In March of 2022 the Holy Father appointed Fr. Juan Diego a Missionary of Mercy, granting him faculties to hear confessions at any time and place and to absolve sins in cases otherwise reserved to the Holy See.

Fr. Juan Diego is a friar at heart. His spirituality is deeply Franciscan, joyful, incarnational, scriptural, and Eucharistic. He also enjoys woodworking, cooking, writing, reading history and literature.







CELEBRATE WITH THE MOST EXALTED PRAISES

Now Mary has her proper habitation in Heaven, into which today she is translated from earth, for Heaven is a most fitting place for her. She stands at the right side of the Almighty "adorned in golden robes, arrayed in diverse colors" (Ps. 44 [45]: 9-10), as the Prophet-King David said of her. Beneath the golden robes, her divinely radiant body is arrayed with the diverse colors of all virtues. She alone, in her bodyglorified by God, enjoys the celestial habitations with her Son. The earth, the grave and death could not hold forever her life-originating and God receiving body - a dwelling place more radiant than Heaven and the habitation of the heavens.

Therefore, the body which gave birth, is glorified together with the One Who is born, with glory befitting God, and it is raised together. The "Ark of Holiness" (Ps.131 [132]: 8) is resurrected together

with Christ, Who arose on the third day, as expressed in prophetic song. There was, moreover, the evidence for the Apostles of her resurrection from the dead: the shroud and burial cloths, which remained in the grave, and which alone were found there by those who came to look things over: just as it had been with her Son and Lord.

It was unnecessary that she should wait a certain while upon the earth, as had her Son and God; and therefore, she was taken directly from the grave into a celestial habitation, from whence she shines with a resplendent radiance, illuminating all the earth. For the faithful, this is something worthy of veneration, worthy of praise and of song In this way, she was at the start, "a little lower than the angels" (Ps. 8:6) in her mortality, but this only served to the increase the majesty of the Mother of God. Therefore, it is entirely proper that everyone gather today and commune for the present Feast.
