Bulletin Release – Season of Creation – September 1 – October 4

Celebrating Five Years

The Season of Creation is an annual celebration of prayer and action intended to increase awareness of God's love and protection of His creation. It is celebrated by Christians of all traditions, and the leaders of various churches have encouraged the faithful to participate. The season begins on September 1, the World Day of Prayer for Creation, and runs through October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology in many Western traditions. September 1 was proclaimed World Day of Prayer for Creation, or Creation Day by Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I from the Orthodox in 1989, and was embraced by the other major Christian European churches in 2001 and by Pope Francis for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015.

Under the leadership of the Human and Environment Development Program at the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Saskatoon, the inaugural celebration of the Season of Creation in Saskatoon in 2018 was celebrated. Since that time, the event has invited not only Christians of various denominations but also people of other faith traditions to pray together. Because of the pandemic an Akathist of Thanksgiving prayer service was produced at St. George's Cathedral in 2020 and another video was produced at St. Athanasius Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral in Regina, Saskatchewan in 2021. The Akathist of Thanksgiving is a very moving and poetic hymn of praise written in the severe conditions of a Soviet prison camp in 1940. This service bears witness not only to the depth of the spiritual vision and poetic beauty of Father Gregory Petrov's soul, but also to an adoration-centered way of being. In its rich and ancient liturgical traditions, the Eastern Church conveys a profound understanding of creation and the role of humanity. The words in the Akathist hymn capture the heart and soul of the Eastern Church and how She understands our relationship with creation and the Creator. No doubt, the celebrations of the Eastern Christian Churches can serve as an example for all faiths of the world and indeed the entire world.

This year to celebrate the fifth anniversary of the Season of Creation, a four-part video series is being produced on the theme of iconography and the Eastern Christian understanding of our material world. Our special guest, iconographer Anna Mycyk is being featured. When the video series is complete and uploaded onto the Eparchial website, I invite you to listen attentively to Anna Mycyk's deep understanding of God's presence in icons and the material world. The whole of the universe worships and offers gifts of praise and thanksgiving to its Creator.




