SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

TROPAR (Tone 8): You came down from on high, O Merciful One, and accepted three days of burial to free us from our sufferings. O Lord, our life and our resurrection, glory be to You.

Therefore, 'Come out from among them,' says the Lord; 'and touch nothing unclean. I will welcome you and be a father to you and you will be my sons and daughters,' says the Lord Almighty." Since we have these promises, beloved, let us purify ourselves from every defilement of flesh and spirit, and in the fear of God strive to fulfill our consecration perfectly.

At that time Jesus entered into the district of Tyre and Sidon. It happened that a Canaanite woman living in that locality presented herself, crying out to him, "Lord, Son of David, have pity on me! My daughter is terribly troubled by a demon." He gave her no word of response. His disciples came up and began to entreat him, "Get rid of her. She keeps shouting after us." "My mission is only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel," Jesus replied. She came forward then and did him homage with the plea, "Help me, Lord!" But he answered, "it is not right to take the food of sons and daughters and throw it to the dogs." "Please, Lord," she insisted, "even the dogs eat the leavings that fall from their masters' tables." Jesus said in reply, "Woman, you have great faith! Your wish will come to pass." That very moment her daughter got better.

FUNERALS AT OUR PARISH

When a parishioner dies, it is important that we honour the deceased with a Christian Funeral. It is essential that you contact the Parish Priest to let him know that the person has died and then contact a local funeral home for the funeral arrangements.



The Funeral Service

Usually, a *Parastas and/or Panakhyda* (memorial service also called Prayers) is served the evening before the funeral. On the day of the funeral, while at Roman Catholic Church a Mass for the Deceased is celebrated, in Ukrainian Catholic Tradition the Funeral Service is celebrated, therefore, a Divine Liturgy or Eucharist is not attached to it.

Divine Liturgy for the Deceased are celebrated after the burial in the Ukrainian church and may be served 3, 9, 40 days and 1 year service etc.

The Funeral Service of Our Church is deeply impressive, as well as truly meaningful and uplifting. It is profoundly moving, based in the Psalms, various hymns and a blessing of the body. The celebration is a truthful meditation on life and death, reminding us how precious and short life is and how it should be spent in union with God.

Cremation

The Church sincerely recommends that the pious custom of burial be retained; but it does not forbid cremation, unless this is chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching (Canon 876, §3).

If the cremation is preferred because of certain circumstances, please make sure you are familiar with the current teaching of the Church and the Eparchial policy regarding it. The Eparchial Funeral directives about cremation are more or less the same as those of Roman Catholics. In any case, the decision to cremate should never be taken hurriedly and always in consultation with your parish priest.

The Catholic Church strongly recommends that the funeral service should be performed in the <u>presence of the body of the deceased before it is cremated</u>. The presence of the body over which the church community is praying is an essential and deeply meaningful feature of the Church's funeral rites.

Most parishioners are familiar with our funeral customs but if you are unsure, you can always contact the Parish Priest who will answer any questions you may have.

Business Arising

- The website redevelopment continues as Father and the developer continue working on improvements. Our developer has moved on to a new job and is unable to continue with us, so Father will continue the rebuild on his own. There is a person from Syro Malabar Parish who is familiar with the platform and may be able to assist Father Vasyl.

If you, or someone you know, would be interested in joining our Livestream Team we are looking for people to help. Full training is available.

- Syro Malabar Father Daris and one of their trustees joined the meeting briefly. They invited St. Athanasius parishioners to attend their services the last Sunday of the month is in English. They also have their Parish Feast Day on October 23 to which St. Athanasius parishioners are invited. St. Athanasius will again lease Syro Malabar space in 2023.
- Security Cameras The cameras have been installed at the rectory and the Parish complex and are now fully operational. Signage has been installed that indicates that security cameras are in use for those entering the complex.
- The photo icon project for the front lobby continues to be developed with progress slowed as the artists is volunteering with the war effort.

 will not be coffee if no one is signed up to help and we are VERY short of volunteers at
 the moment.
- Support for Ukraine The donations are noted weekly in the bulletin your generosity is very much appreciated, and Father Vasyl and the Social Justice Committee have begun the process of distributing funds. We wish to thank all of the Parishioners who have donated funds or goods, as well as those who have been driving the newcomers to appointments, church etc.





LIFE WITHOUT GOD

If we were to take "Christ out of the word "Christian" nothing of meaning would be left. With the three letters "ian" we can arrange the letters to have the meaning: "I am nothing." Isn't it true what Jesus said, "Without me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). Apart from Christ we are nothing and can do nothing. All things that we value, all conditions necessary for happiness depend upon God.

Without God there would be no conscience, no morality that incites us to do good and avoid evil. Only where there is faith, belief in God, will the condition of people rest on a firm foundation. Only where people are ruled by God, who has set up limits of behavior for our own good, can there be equity and equality.

Where people do not obey the law of legitimate authority, we have the law of the jungle. Without law neither life nor property are safe. Without God and His law there would not be enough jails, police and legal penalties to deter the threat of death and crime. Life would be a living hell.

Without God greed, sensuality and tyranny would enslave everyone. Conflict among all and against all would be the inevitable result. The weak would be oppressed by the more powerful. Peace on earth would be impossible.

Psalm 119 gives us a taste of happiness with God. "They are happy whose life is blameless, who walk in the law of the Lord.

Happy are they who observe His decrees, who seek Him with all their hearts ... "
