FIRST SUNDAY OF THE GREAT FAST

INSTEAD OF First Antiphon: p, 21 "Bless the Lord..." (First Psalm of Typica)

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and let all that is within me bless His holy name.

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits.

He forgives all your iniquities, He heals all your diseases.

He redeems your life from corruption, He crowns you with mercy and compassion.

Compassionate and merciful is the Lord, long-suffering and abounding in mercy.

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and let all that is within me bless His Holy name.

Blessed are You, O Lord.

INSTEAD OF Third Antiphon: p, 27 "Remember us..." (The Beatitudes)

Remember us, O Lord, in Your kingdom.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the pure of heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil word against you falsely because of Me.

Rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven.

TROPAR (Tone 5): Let us the faithful acclaim and worship the Word co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, and born of the Virgin for our salvation. For He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh, to suffer death and to raise the dead by His glorious resurrection.

TROPAR First Sunday of Lent (Tone 2): We pay homage to Your undefiled image, Good Lord, and beg pardon for our faults, Christ our God. By Your will You chose to mount the cross in Your flesh to free Your creatures from slavery to the enemy. For this we gratefully cry out to You: "By coming to save the world, our Saviour, You filled all things with joy."

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

KONDAK (Tone 8): The uncircumscribed Word of the Father became circumscribed by being enfleshed from you, Godbearer. You brought back the stained image to its original state by infusing it with divine beauty. But recognizing our salvation we portray it by word and deed.

PROKIMEN (Tone 4): Blessed are you, and praiseworthy, O Lord, the God of our fathers, and glorious forever is your name.

Verse: For you are just in all you have done.

A reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews (11:24-26; 32 -12:2)

Brothers and Sisters! By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter; he wished to be ill-treated along with God's people rather than enjoy the fleeting rewards of sin. Moses considered the reproach borne by God's Anointed greater riches than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward. What more shall I recount? I have no time to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who by faith conquered kingdoms, did what was just, obtained the promises; they broke the jaws of lions, put out raging fires, escaped the devouring sword; though weak they were made powerful, became strong in battle, and turned back foreign invaders. Women received back their dead through resurrection. Others were tortured and would not receive deliverance, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Still others endured mockery, scourging, even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, sawed in two, put to death at sword's point; they went about garbed in the skins of sheep or goats, needy, afflicted, tormented. The world was not worthy of them. They wandered about in deserts and on mountains, they dwelt in caves and in holes of the earth. Yet despite the fact that all of these were approved because of their faith, they did not obtain what had been promised. God had made a better plan, a plan which included us. Without us, they were not to be made perfect.

Therefore, since we for our part are surrounded by this cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every encumbrance of sin which clings to us and persevere in running the race which lies ahead. Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who inspires and perfects our faith.

ALLELUIA VERSES: Moses and Aaron are among His priests and Samuel among those who call upon His name.

They called upon the Lord, and he answered them.

GOSPEL: John (1: 43-51)

At that time Jesus set out for Galilee, but first he came upon Philip. "Follow me," Jesus said to him. Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the same town as Andrew and Peter. Philip sought out Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses spoke of in the law-the prophets too -- Jesus, son of Joseph, from Nazareth." Nathanael's response to that was, "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" and Philip replied, "Come, see for yourself." When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he remarked: "This man is a true Israelite. There is no guile in him." "How do you know me?" Nathanael asked him. "Before Philip called you," Jesus answered, "I saw you under the fig tree." "Rabbi," said Nathanael, "you are the Son of God; you are the king of Israel." Jesus responded: "Do you believe just because I told you I saw you under the fig tree? You will see much greater things than that." He went on to tell them, "I solemnly assure you, you shall see the sky opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

INSTEAD OF 'It Is Truly Right': In you, Lady full of grace, all creation rejoices, the world of angels and the human race. Sanctified temple, spiritual paradise, boast of virgins, God took flesh from you and became a child; He was God before the ages. He made your womb a throne and made it more encompassing than the heavens. In you, Lady full of grace, all creation rejoices, glory be to you.



Communal Lenten Prayers of our Church

Every year, starting the Great Lent, we ask ourselves: "How good Christians are we"? We try to analyze our spiritual state and make decisions for ourselves at this time. Our Liturgical services of the Great Lent (*Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts, Lenten Akafist, Great Canon of St. Andrew of Crete, Prayer of St. Ephraim Syrian and others*) are proposed to help us understand the essence of the Great Lent, to know the beauty of the Lenten prayers. They are built in the manner that everyone can conveniently participate in the great renewal.

The communal prayer is strongly recommended for all who are interested in their spiritual development and their desire to meet Christ's Resurrection, having gone through the path of renewal through prayer, spiritual fast, reflection and personal experience.

THE MAIN RULE OF FASTING - "DO NOT EAT EACH OTHER..."

Lent - the Great Fast - begins forty days before Palm Sunday, on the Monday after Forgiveness Sunday (Cheese- Fare Sunday), and lasts until the Friday preceding Palm Sunday.

Holy Week is a special Fast in honor of our Lord's Passion, and lasts from the evening of Palm Sunday until Holy Saturday inclusive.

According to the directions of the Episcopal Synods of Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church the canonical prescriptions for fasting are **UGCC Part.Law Can. 115**§ 2. (CCEO, c. 882):


- 1) A strict fast is observed on the first day of the Great Fast and Passion Friday, i.e. abstention from meat and dairy products and eggs, as well as foods that contain these ingredients.
- 2) Abstention from all meat and foods containing meat is to be observed during the first week of the Great Fast and all days of Passion Week.
- 3) During the Great Fast, abstention from the consumption of meat and meat products is to be observed on all Mondays, avoided Wednesdays and Fridays. All other foods are permitted on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays.

Prayer & Good Works: All faithful are urged to attend, besides the regular Sunday and Holiday services, the special services of the Great Lent. They are exhorted to perform Christian and penitential deeds of charity.

Following the Church's recommendations about fast, we do not only fast from food, in today's world, we also need to fast from television, internet, computer, games or anything else that prevents us from hearing God's voice of Gospels.

All that the Church recommends to observe regarding the fasting is solely for the welfare of the faithful. It must be understood that the requirements for fasting are recommended only to healthy Christians who do not have any dependence on work, road, training, pregnancy, and much more. Following all previous rules, the Church, considering the present-day life and circumstances, prescribes all the recommended requirements for fasting on the conscience, conditions and current circumstances of the life of Christians.

A Life-Changing Study for the Whole Parish!



Session One: Where Are You?

What are we to do with guilt? Should it be ignored, or does it present an opportunity we don't want to miss? The truth is, God seeks us out when we have sinned, not to scold or punish us, but to offer us his healing and his forgiveness. It's certainly true that God is omnipotent and just, but before all else he is our loving, merciful Father.
