INSTEAD OF First Antiphon: p, 21 "Bless the Lord..." (First Psalm of Typica)

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and let all that is within me bless His holy name.

He forgives all your iniquities, He heals all your diseases.

He redeems your life from corruption, He crowns you with mercy and compassion.

A reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews (1: 10 - 2:3)

Brothers and Sisters Lord of old you established the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. They will perish, but you remain; all of them will grow old like a garment. You will roll them up like a cloak, like a garment they will be changed. But you are the same, and your years will have no end. To which of the angels has God even said, "Sit at my right hand till I make your enemies your footstool?" Are they not all ministering spirits, sent to serve those who are to inherit salvation? In view of this, we must attend all the more to what we have heard, lest we drift away. For if the word spoken through angels stood unchanged, and all transgression and disobedience received its due punishment, how shall we escape if we ignore a salvation as great as ours? Announced first by the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who had heard him.

ALLELUIA VERSES: He who lives in the aid of the Most High, shall dwell under the protection of the God of heaven.

He says to the Lord: You are my protector and my refuge, my God, in Whom I hope.

GOSPEL: Mark (2: 1-12)

At that time when Jesus came to Capernaum after a lapse of several days and word got around that he was at home. At that they began to gather in great numbers. There was no longer any room for them, even around the door. While he was delivering God's word to them, some people arrived bringing a paralyzed man to him. The four who carried him were unable to bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, so they began to open up the roof over the spot where Jesus was. When they had made a hole, they let down the mat

on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralyzed man, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there asking themselves: "Why does the man talk in that way? He commits blasphemy! Who can forgive sins except God alone?" Jesus was immediately aware of their reasoning, though they kept it to themselves, and he said to them: "Why do you harbor these thoughts? Which is easier to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven, or to say, 'Stand up, pick up your mat, and walk again.'? That you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" (he said to the paralyzed man), "I command you: Stand up! Pick up your mat and go home." The man stood and picked up his mat and went outside in the sight of everyone. They were awestruck; all gave praise to God saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

INSTEAD OF 'It Is Truly Right': In you, Lady full of grace, all creation rejoices, the world of angels and the human race. Sanctified temple, spiritual paradise, boast of virgins, God took flesh from you and became a child; He was God before the ages. He made your womb a throne and made it more encompassing than the heavens. In you, Lady full of grace, all creation rejoices, glory be to you.

SOROKOUSTY SERVICES – ALL SOULS SATURDAYS

Sorokousty Services (All Souls Saturday) will be celebrated this year **on March 11**, **March 18**, **and May 27**.

The word "Sorokousty" literally means "forty mouths" (*sorok* = *forty*; *ust* = *mouth*). Originally, this was a prayer service offered by forty mouths or by forty priests especially in Lenten time.

Sorokousty or All Souls Saturdays services have been celebrated for deceased by holding Liturgies, Panakhydas or Parastas for them in five Saturdays.

Each family in our parish has a book or a list where the names of deceased family members are written. Father reads out every book or list during each Sorokousty.





THE MAIN RULE OF FASTING - "DO NOT EAT EACH OTHER..."

Lent - the Great Fast - begins forty days before Palm Sunday, on the Monday after Forgiveness Sunday (Cheese- Fare Sunday), and lasts until the Friday preceding Palm Sunday.

Holy Week is a special Fast in honor of our Lord's Passion, and lasts from the evening of Palm Sunday until Holy Saturday inclusive.

According to the directions of the Episcopal Synods of Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church the canonical prescriptions for fasting are **UGCC Part.Law Can. 115**§ 2. (CCEO, c. 882):

- 1) A strict fast is observed on the first day of the Great Fast and Passion Friday, i.e. abstention from meat and dairy products and eggs, as well as foods that contain these ingredients.
- 2) Abstention from all meat and foods containing meat is to be observed during the first week of the Great Fast and all days of Passion Week.
- 3) During the Great Fast, abstention from the consumption of meat and meat products is to be observed on all Mondays, avoided Wednesdays and Fridays. All other foods are permitted on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays.

Prayer & Good Works: All faithful are urged to attend, besides the regular Sunday and Holiday services, the special services of the Great Lent. They are exhorted to perform Christian and penitential deeds of charity.

Following the Church's recommendations about fast, we do not only fast from food, in today's world, we also need to fast from television, internet, computer, games or anything else that prevents us from hearing God's voice of Gospels.

All that the Church recommends to observe regarding the fasting is solely for the welfare of the faithful. It must be understood that the requirements for fasting are recommended only to healthy Christians who do not have any dependence on work, road, training, pregnancy, and much more. Following all previous rules, the Church, considering the present-day life and circumstances, prescribes all the recommended requirements for fasting on the conscience, conditions and current circumstances of the life of Christians.

The Renewal that is the Sabbath

Another reason why the Sabbath day was blessed is that he who formed this world in six days foresaw that man would turn towards evil and would, as a result, go back to the ground, descend to Hades, and be imprisoned there, and this whole world would grow old and useless because of man, but would be renewed by God becoming man.

This renewal was effected when God incarnate descended into Hades through death and declined there on the Sabbath the recall of souls. It was because he foresaw that this would happen on the Sabbath that he rightly deemed it the only day worthy to be blessed. However, although this work was secretly made ready on the seventh day, the Sabbath, everything was

clearly brought to light and accomplished when the body too had been summoned to immortality through the Lord's Resurrection on the eighth day. This is why we call it the Lord's Day.

As Friday, the day of preparation, stands in relation to the Sabbath, so is the Sabbath in comparison with Sunday, which is obviously superior to it. As perfection and reality surplus beginning, pattern, and shadow, so is Sunday more excellent and honorable, because on it the exceedingly blessed work was finished, and on it we await the General Resurrection of all, the perfect entry of the saints into the divine rest and dissolution of the world into its elements.
