NINTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

TROPAR (Tone 8): You came down from on high, O Merciful One, and accepted three days of burial to free us from our sufferings. O Lord, our life and our resurrection, glory be to You.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

KONDAK (Tone 8): When You rose from the tomb, You also raised the dead and resurrected Adam. Eve exults in Your resurrection, and the ends of the world celebrate Your rising from the dead, O most merciful One.

PROKIMEN (Tone 8): Pray and give paise to the Lord our God. Verse: In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel.

EPISTLE: A reading from the First Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians. (3:9-17)

Brothers and Sisters! We are God's co-workers; while you are his cultivation, his building. Thanks to the favor God showed me I laid a foundation as a wise master builder might do, and now someone else is building upon it. Everyone, however, must be careful how he builds. No one can lay a foundation other than the one that has been laid, namely Jesus Christ. If different ones build on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay or straw, the work of each will be made clear. The Day will disclose it. That day will make its appearance with fire, and fire will test the quality of each man's work. If the building a man has raised on this foundation still stands, he will receive his recompense; if a man's building burns, he will suffer loss. He himself will be saved, but only as one fleeing through fire. Are you not aware that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, and you are that temple.

ALLELUIA VERSES: Come, let us rejoice in the Lord; let us acclaim God our Saviour. Let us come before His countenance with praise and acclaim Him with psalms.

GOSPEL: Matthew 14: 22-34

At that time while dismissing the crowds, Jesus insisted that his disciples get into the oat and precede him to the other side. When he had sent them away, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray, remaining there alone as evening drew on. Meanwhile the boat, already several hundred yards out from shore, was being tossed about in the waves, raised by strong head winds. At about three in the morning, He came walking toward them on the lake. When the disciples saw him walking on the water, they were terrified. "It is a ghost!" they said, and in their fear they began to cry out. Jesus hastened to reassure them: "Get hold of yourselves! It is I. Do not be afraid!" Peter spoke up and said, "Lord, if it is really you, tell me to come to you across the water." "Come!" He said. So Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water, moving toward Jesus. But when he perceived how strong the wind was, becoming frightened, he began to sink and cried out "Lord, save me!" Jesus at once stretched out his hand and caught him. "How little faith you," he exclaimed. "Why did you falter?" Once they had climbed into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat showed him

reverence, declaring, "Beyond doubt you are the Son of God." After making the crossing they reached the shore at Gennesaret.



NINTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Icon of Saints Callinicus and Theodotia -- July 29th



How different and paradoxical is what happened to us who received holy Baptism! We did not really die, nor were we really buried, nor even were we really crucified and raised again. Everything that took place was iconic imitation. Yet they constituted for us our true salvation. Christ was actually crucified and buried, and truly rose again. He freely bestowed on us all these things, so that we might truly gain salvation by imitatively participating in the sufferings of Christ. What a surpassing love for humanity! Christ allowed nails to be attached to His immaculate hands, and suffered anguish. To me, however, He freely bestows salvation without pain or toil but by making me a communicant of His suffering.

Let no one suppose that Baptism is merely for the forgiveness of sins and adoption, as John's baptism was only for the forgiveness of sins. We should fully know that that Baptism effects in us the cleansing of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit, and additionally, it is equivalent to the sufferings of Christ. For this reason Paul

shouts and says, "Are you not aware that all of us who were baptized in Christ Jesus, were baptized into His death? So, we were buried with Him by baptism into death" (Rom. 6:3-4) I beseech you, then, to constantly maintain in your memory these things which you have sufficiently learned...
