

SUNDAY OF THE HOLY FOREFATHERS

TROPAR (Tone 4): When the disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the glorious news of the resurrection and cast off the ancestral condemnation, they proudly told the apostles: "Death has been plundered! Christ our God is risen granting to the world great mercy."

TROPAR OF THE FOREFATHERS (Tone 2): O Christ, You have justified the forefathers by faith, thus forming through them the Church of the gentiles. These saints are glorified because the Virgin who bore You descends from them. O Christ God, through their prayers have mercy on us.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

KONDAK OF THE FOREFATHERS (Tone 6): Armed with invisible power, you did not adore the idols made by human hands, O thrice-holy youths; strengthened by a power beyond words, you stood in the midst of a devouring fire and called upon God, saying, "Hasten, O merciful One, and speed to our help, for You are good and have power to do whatever you desire."

PROKIMEN (Tone 4): Blessed are you, and praiseworthy, O Lord, the God of our fathers, and glorious forever is your name.

VERSE: For you are just in all you have done.

EPISTLE: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Colossians (3: 4 - 11)

Brothers and Sisters! When Christ our life appears, then you shall appear with him in glory. Put to death whatever in your nature is rooted in earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desires, and that lust which is idolatry. These are the sins which provoke God's wrath. Your own conduct was once of this sort, when these sins were your very life. You must put that aside now: all the anger and quick temper, the malice, the insults, the foul language. Stop lying to one another. What you have done is put aside your old self with its past deeds and put on a new man, one who grows in knowledge as he is formed anew in the image of his Creator. There is no Greek or Jew here, circumcised or uncircumcised, foreigner Scythian, slave, or freeman. Rather, Christ is everything in all of you.

ALLELUIA VERSES: Moses and Aaron were among his priests, and Samuel, among those who called upon his name.

They called upon the Lord, and he answered them.

GOSPEL: Luke (17: 11-19)

At that time the disciples had asked Jesus, Master "Increase our faith". Then, On the way to Jerusalem he was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests."

And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan.

Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

COMMUNION HYMN: Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest.

Exult, you just, in the Lord; praise from the upright is fitting. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!



Prayer Thermometer:



CIX! Our Catechism class would like to challenge us all to pray together as a church family. From now until Christmas when pray Our Father, Hail Mary and the Rosay at home, work or church etc. please keep a tally of how many prayers you recite. Tally sheets are available at the entrance. Each Our Father and Hail Mary count as one point and each Rosary counts as 59 points. For example you may count your daily prayers, prayers before meals, opening prayers at meetings, rosary at church or even the our Father during liturgy. All these prayers can be recorded. You can keep track individually or as a family on the tally sheets. The tally sheets should be turned in each week so that we can mark the totals on the thermometer located at the entrance of the church. There will be a container to drop off your tally sheets. Remember that a family that prays together stays together. May God Bless you all as we pray and prepare for the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!



COME, LORD JESUS

When Daniel the Prophet exercised his ministry in the Exile, his three young friends were also brought to the attention of the King. Upon refusing to comply with the ruler's ungodly orders, they were thrown into a furnace. The king, sitting nearby to witness the execution, saw a strange figure in the furnace with the three youths, and this figure was "like a son of man."

The Fathers of the Church were of the opinion that this figure in the furnace was the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, the Word of God, who

would be incarnated as Jesus of Nazareth.

What lessons are there for us on this third Sunday before Christmas? We open the Christmas cycle with a look at longing and expectation - with a look at patience and hope. As Christians we expect a future. We remember the words of the Son of Man - the long-awaited Savior - that on a day yet to come He will return to earth. "You will see the Son of Man," said Jesus, "coming on the clouds of heaven." We likewise refresh our belief that our Savior is as truly Man as He is God. He is - as the Son of Man - the very epitome of all that is noble, fine and good in a human being.

We also begin this Christmas cycle with a reminder that true love looks to the future, to provide something for the coming generation, for just as we stand on the shoulder of faith of our ancestors, the coming generation will stand on the platform of faith we construct. We are like a layer of bricks resting on previous layers, and upon which furture layers will be cemented, until we constitute the walls of a temple which God will dwell. The cornerstone of this grand design is Jesus Christ, the Son of Man, the anniversary of whose birth we are shorly to celebrate.
