ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

TROPAR (Tone 2): When You went down to death, O Life Immortal, You struck Hades dead with the blazing light of Your divinity. When You raised the dead from the nether world, all the powers of heaven cried out: “O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory be to You!”

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

KONDAK (Tone 2): You rose from the tomb, O almighty Savior; and Hades, seeing this wonder, was stricken with fear; and the dead arose. Creation saw and rejoices with You, and Adam exults. And the world, my Savior, sings Your praises for ever.

PROKIMEN (Tone 2): The Lord is my strength and my song of praise, and He has become my salvation.

Verse: *The Lord has indeed chastised me, but He has not delivered me to death.*

EPISTLE: A reading from the First Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians.
(9: 2-12)

Brothers and Sisters! You are the very seal of my apostolate in the Lord. My defense against those who criticize me is this: Do we not have the right to eat and drink? Do we not have the right to marry a believing woman like the rest of the apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? Is it only myself and Barnabas who are forced to work for a living? What soldier in the field pays for his rations? Who plants a vineyard and does not eat of its yield? What shepherd does not nourish himself with the milk of his flock? You may think the reasons I am giving are merely human ones, but does not the law itself speak of these things? It is written in the law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox while it treads out grain." Is God concerned here for oxen, or does he not rather say this for our sakes? You can be sure it was written for us, for the plowman should plow in hope and the harvester expect a share in the grain. If we have sown for you in the spirit, is it too much to expect a material harvest from you? If others have this right over you, is not our right even greater? But we have not used this right. On the contrary, we put up with all sorts of hardships so as not to place any obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ.

ALLELUIA VERSES: *The Lord will hear you in the day of tribulation; the name of the God of Jacob will shield you.*

Lord, grant victory to the king, and hear us in the day that we shall call upon You.

GOSPEL: Matthew (17: 14-23)

The Lord said: "The reign of God may be said to be like a king who decided to settle accounts with his officials. When he began his auditing, one was brought in who owed him a huge amount. As he had no way of paying it, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that the official prostrated himself in homage and said, 'My lord, be patient with me and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with pity, the master let the official go and wrote off the debt. But when that same official went out he met a fellow servant who owed him a mere fraction of what he himself owed. He seized him and throttled him, 'Pay back what you owe,' he demanded. His fellow servant dropped to his knees and began to plead with him, 'Just give me time and I will pay you back in full.' But he would hear none of it. Instead, he had him put in jail until he paid back what he owed. When his fellow servants saw what had happened they were badly shaken, and went to their master to report the whole incident. His master sent for him and said, 'You worthless wretch! I cancelled your entire debt when you pleaded with me. Should you not have dealt mercifully with your fellow servant, as I dealt with you?' Then in anger the master handed him over to the torturers until he paid back all that he owed. My heavenly Father will treat you in exactly the same way unless each of you forgives his brother from his heart."

The Ukrainian Program will continue with its delivery of the program in the evenings. RCSD does not pay for the transportation costs. The Ukrainian Program will continue to be held at St. Matthew School.

The program will have a two-prong approach to delivery, online instruction and information as well as face-to-face instruction. The program will run on Wednesday and Thursday evenings at St. Matthew School. The Ukrainian program will begin on September 10 & 11, 2025.

Wednesday – 4:30 – 6:30 p.m.
Thursday – 6:00 – 8:00 p.m.

We are allowing parents to bring their children on either of those evenings. Grades 1-4 will be with Mrs. Kohuch and grades 5-8 will be with Mrs. Zwarych. We will no longer be using the day system since that no longer applies, as our classes will be after school. After the program, all are invited to stay for a time of fellowship and a light lunch, providing an opportunity to connect and share in the spirit of community.



OUR PARKING LOT IS BROKEN!!!

We are sure you have all noticed, our parking lot is falling apart and in desperate need of repair. After a lot of searching for a contractor to come and have a look at it, we received a quote from only one contractor who was interested in such a small job. Parish Council has approved proceeding with this contractor to repair the parking lot in the spring of 2025 at a cost of between \$70,000 and \$75,000, depending on prices in the spring. This includes removal of the existing pavement and cement, and replacement of any base material as required, and in the installation of speed bumps to slow down any through traffic to Huda School.

We are asking you, our Parishioners, to help fund this significant cost through our Building Fund donations. The parking lot is approximately 1000 square metres and we are suggesting a donation of \$100 for each square metre of the parking lot that you wish to fund. Of course, any donation to the Building Fund would be welcomed and appreciated. We hope you can assist us in this much needed repair.

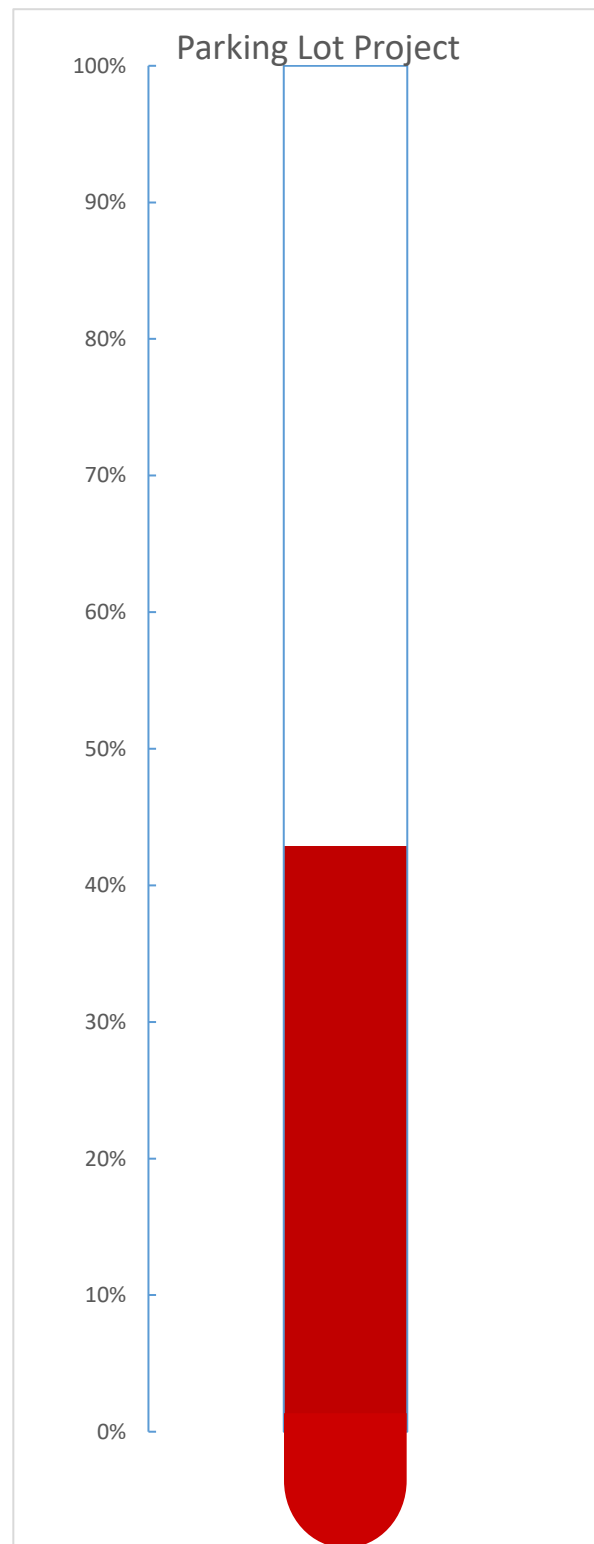

The Twelve Apostles: Timid Men Who Won the World

It was clear through unlearned men that the cross was persuasive, in fact, it persuaded the whole world. Their discourse was not of unimportant matters but of God and true religion, of the Gospel way of life and future judgment, yet it turned plain, uneducated men into philosophers. How the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and his weakness stronger than men!

In what way is it stronger? It made its way throughout the world and overcame all men; countless men sought to eradicate the very name of the Crucified, but that name flourished and grew ever mightier. Its enemies lost out and perished; the living who waged a war on a dead man proved helpless. For the good deeds which tax-collectors and fishermen were able to accomplish by God's grace, the philosophers, the rulers, the countless multitudes cannot even imagine.

Paul had this in mind when he said: The weakness of God is stronger than men. That the preaching of these men was indeed divine is brought home to us in the same way. For how otherwise could twelve uneducated men, who lived on lakes and rivers and wastelands, get the idea for such an immense enterprise?

How could men who perhaps had never been in a city or a public square think of setting out to do battle with the whole world? That they were fearful, timid men, the evangelist makes clear; he did not reject the fact or try to hide their weaknesses. Indeed, he turned these into a proof of the truth. What did he say of them? That when Christ was arrested, the others fled, despite all the miracles they had seen, while he who was leader of the others denied him!

It is evident, then, that if they had not seen him risen and had proof of His power, they would not have risked so much.
