#### TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

TROPAR (Tone 3): Let the heavens be glad, let the earth rejoice, for the Lord has done a mighty deed with His arm. He trampled death by death; He became the first born of the dead; He saved us from the abyss of Hades and granted great mercy to the world.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

KONDAK (Tone 3): You rose from the tomb, O compassionate Lord, and led us out from the gates of death. Today Adam exults and Eve rejoices, and the prophets together with the patriarchs unceasingly acclaim the divine might of Your power.

**PROKIMEN** (Tone 3): Sing to our God, sing; sing to our King, sing.

Verse: Clap your hands, all you nations; shout unto God with the voice of joy.

EPISTLE: A reading from the First Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians. (15: 1-11)

Brothers and Sisters! I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and in which you stand firm. You are being saved by it at this very moment if you hold fast to it as I preached it to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. I handed on to you first of all what I myself received that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried and, in accordance with the Scriptures, rose on the third day; that he was seen by Cephas, then by the Twelve. After that he was seen by five hundred brothers at once, most of whom are still alive, although some have fallen asleep. Next, he was seen by James; then by all the apostles. Last of all he was seen by me, as one born out of the normal course. I am the least of the apostles; in fact, because I persecuted the church of God, I do not even deserve the name. But by God's favor I am what I am. This favor of his to me has not proved fruitless. Indeed, I have worked harder than all the others, not on my own but through the favor of God. In any case, whether it be I or they, this is what we preach and this is what you believed.

ALLELUIA VERSES: In You, O Lord, have I hoped that I may not be put to shame for ever.

Be a protector unto me, O God, and a house of refuge to save me.

**GOSPEL: Matthew (19:16-26)** 

At that time a young man came up to him and said, "Teacher, what good must I do to possess everlasting life?" He answered, "Why do you question me about what is good? There is One who is good. If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." "Which ones?" he asked. Jesus replied, "'You shall not kill'; 'You shall not commit adultery'; 'You shall not steal'; 'You shall not bear false witness'; 'Honor your father and your mother'; and 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' "The young man said to him, "I have kept all these; what do I need to do further?" Jesus told him, "If you seek

perfection, go, sell your possessions, and give to the poor. You will then have treasure in heaven. Afterward, comeback and follow me." Hearing these words, the young man went away sad, for his possessions were many. Jesus said to his disciples, "I assure you, only with difficulty will a rich man enter into the kingdom of God. I repeat what I said: it is easier for a camel to pass through a needle's eye than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this, they were completely overwhelmed, and exclaimed, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For man it is impossible; but for God all things are possible."



The program will have a two-prong approach to delivery, online instruction and information as well as face-to-face instruction. The program will run on Wednesday and Thursday evenings at St. Matthew School. The Ukrainian program will begin on September 10 & 11, 2025.

Wednesday -4:30 - 6:30 p.m. Thursday -6:00 - 8:00 p.m.

We are allowing parents to bring their children on either of those evenings. Grades 1-4 will be with Mrs. Kohuch and grades 5-8 will be with Mrs. Zwarych. We will no longer be using the day system since that no longer applies, as our classes will be after school. 
Let us gather at the Millennium Cross for prayer, reflection, and unity, as we continue to shine the light of hope to build a culture of life through prayer for generations to come.

#### **OUR PARKING LOT IS BROKEN!!!**

We are sure you have all noticed, our parking lot is falling apart and in desperate need of repair. After a lot of searching for a contractor to come and have a look at it, we received a quote from only one contractor who was interested in such a small job. Parish Council has approved proceeding with this contractor to repair the parking lot in the spring of 2025 at a cost of between \$70,000 and \$75,000, depending on prices in the spring. This includes removal of the existing pavement and cement, and replacement of any base material as required, and in the installation of speed bumps to slow down any through traffic to Huda School.




