EPISTLE: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Ephesians. (2: 4-10)

Brothers and Sisters! God is rich in mercy; because of his great love for us he brought us to life with Christ when we were dead in sin. By this favor you were saved. Both with and in Christ Jesus he raised us up and gave us a place in the heavens, that in ages to come he might display his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. I repeat, it is owing to his favor that salvation is yours through faith. This is not your own doing, it is God's gift; neither is it a reward for anything you have accomplished, so let no one pride himself on it. We are truly his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to lead the life of good deeds which God prepared for us in advance.

ALLELUIA VERSES: He who lives in the aid of the Most High, shall dwell under the protection of the God of heaven.

He says to the Lord: You are my protector and my refuge, my God, in Whom I hope.

GOSPEL: Luke (8: 26-39)

At that time, Jesus came into the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite to Galilee. When he came to land, he was met by a man from the town who was possessed by demons. For a long time he had not worn any clothes, he did not live in a house, but among the tombstones. On seeing Jesus he began to shriek; then he fell at his feet and exclaimed at the top of his voice, "Jesus, Son of God Most High, why do you meddle with me? Do not torment me, I beg you." By now Jesus was ordering the unclean spirit to come out of the man. This spirit had taken hold of him many a time. The man used to be tied with chains and fetters, but he would break his bonds and the demon would drive him into places of solitude. "What is your name?" Jesus demanded. "Legion," he answered, because the demons who had entered him were many. They pleaded with him not to order them back to the abyss. It happened that a large herd of swine was feeding nearby on the hillside, and the demons asked him to permit them to enter the swine. This he granted. The demons then came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd charged down the bluff into the lake, where they drowned. When the swineherds saw what had happened, they took to their heels and brought the news to the town and country roundabout. The people went out to see for themselves what had happened. Coming on Jesus, they found the man from whom the devils had departed sitting at his feet dressed and in his full senses; this sight terrified them. They were told by witnesses how the possessed man had been cured. Shortly afterward, the entire population of the Gerasene territory asked Jesus to leave their neighborhood, for a great fear had seized them; so he got into the boat and went back across the lake. The man from whom the devils had departed asked to come with him, but he sent him away with the words, "Go back home and recount all that God has done for you." The man went all through the town making public what Jesus had done for him.


Financial Update

Inquiries regarding the balance of accounts, as well as weekly donations, are available by contacting the Parish office.

- **Sound System Upgrades** last year we submitted a grant to UCFS to upgrade the sound system in the hall. That application was successful and Christie Lights will be installing the new equipment in the coming weeks.
- **Buildings and Grounds –** The furnace and water heater in the hall have been upgraded,
- with funds from a UFCS grant paying for a portion of the costs of the upgrades.
- **The Eparchial Appeal** those grants mentioned above are a result of the Eparchial Appeal so your continued support of this fundraiser is very important.
- Security Basil Kuzyk has taken over responsibility for security issues within the parish. All keyholders will be contacted by Basil for confirmation of the key number, as well as signing a Confidentiality Agreement, and completing the Covenant of Care, as required by the Eparchy. If you are a keyholder and have yet to complete this please contact Basil as soon as possible.
- **Syro Malabar** Parish Council is reviewing the current Syro Malabar lease, as they have expressed interest in renewing their lease with St. Athanasius.

Saint Gregory the Wonderworker

Saint Gregory was of a distinguished pagan family. He was born at Neocaesarea, Pontus, and studied law there. About 233, he and his brother, Athenodorus, accompanied their sister, who was joining her husband in Caesarea, Palestine, while they continued on to Beirut to continue their law studies. They met Origen and instead of going to Beirut, entered his school at Caesarea, studied theology, were converted to Christianity by Origen, and became his disciples. Gregory returned to Neocaesarea about 238, intending to practice law, but was elected bishop by the seventeen Christians of the city.

It soon became apparent that he was gifted with remarkable powers. Hc preached eloquently, made so many converts he was able to build a church, and soon was so renowedl for his miracles that he was surnamed Thaumaturgus (the wonderworker). He was a much-sought-after arbiter for his wisdom and legal knowledge and ability advised his flock to go into hiding when

Decius' persecution of the Christians broke out in 250, and fled to the desert with his deacon.

On his return, he ministered to his flock when plague struck his See and when the Goths devastated Pontus, 252-254, which he described in his "Canonical Letter."

He participated in the synod of Antioch,264-265, and fought sabellianism (a heresy that the three persons of the Trinity are merely different modes or aspects of God, rather than three distinct persons) and Tritheism (the heresy that the Godhead is three separate beings forming three separate gods). It is reported that at his death at Neocaesarea, only seventeen unbelievers were left in the city. He is invoked against floods and earthquakes (at one time he reportedly stopped the flooding Lycus, and at another, he moved a mountain). According to St. Gregory of Nyssa, St. Gregory Thaumaturgus experienced a vision of the Theotokos, the fist such recorded vision.
